The N Gauge 'Pendolino' is being produced with the full support of Virgin Trains. # And Rapido's next British model is...





More information and images will be provided over the coming months and we will have the first pre-production samples of this much requested train at the NEC Warley show in November.



# **BRM** EDITOR'S COMMENT WELCOM

ith all the talk about ready-torun models over recent months, you'd be forgiven for thinking that they were the only option for railway modellers. While there's no question that kit-building has been in decline for some time, and for various reasons, it still has a major role to play in our hobby.

However saturated the RTR locomotive market gets, there will always be gaps in the fleet; classes and sub-classes for which mass production can't be justified due to low demand; obscure prototypes and one-offs or in-service modifications overlooked by the 'big boys'. Blessed as we are with superb locomotives and rolling stock in 2015, **MUCH MORE** if you're looking to model prototypical **ON YOUR** trains from any era or region, it's likely that there will be certain vehicles you can't obtain.

BRM TV While there aren't many diesel classes left untouched by RTR suppliers DVD nowadays, there are literally hundreds of steam locomotives, multiple units, coaches and wagons that haven't been tackled. In many cases, the only way to obtain them is by building kits or, if that's not possible, by scratchbuilding.

Good as the RTR stuff often is, it's always more satisfying to have something unique and personal running on your layout, whether it be a kit-built locomotive, a rebuilt coach or even a simple wagon kit. As you'll have seen in last month's **BRM**, our challenge this year is to encourage as many readers as possible to build, modify or convert a locomotive during 2015. Every month, our modelmakers will tackle different types of kit, conversion projects, a range of materials and common techniques to help you add an extra dimension to your modelling. If you're already an experienced kit-builder, show us what you're working on and maybe share a few tips to help your fellow

conversion projects in the new 'Locomotive Challenge 2015' area on **RMweb** and towards the end of the year, you'll be able to vote for your favourites in each category, which will then be featured in a special edition of BRM.

I'll still be getting stuck in by attempting a Judith Edge Kits Western Region PWM diesel in OO. We hope you'll get involved too.

s the exhibition career of 'Walford Town' drew to a close our group decided that we would like to move on to something new. We had come together to produce the first layout completed to exhibition standards by our club, the Leamington & Warwick Model Railway Society. The L&WMRS had produced several fine layouts before, but they were privately owned by club members. We had some class acts to follow, but felt that we had to keep to the standards already set judging by the

number of invitations to exhibit and awards received over the years.

As a group we had formed good friendships from working together and going to shows. The strength and success of the group was put down to having similar aspirations with regard to what constituted a satisfying layout to build and operate. Because we had had so much fun in this endeavour there was enthusiasm to continue and build another layout together.


'Walford Town' was EM Gauge, with 18.2 mm gauge - as opposed to the original EM standard of 18.0 mm. Several of us were already P4 modellers, so we decided the new layout would be to those standards. Many discussions took place as to what, where and when should be the new project.

Walford was a diesel layout and when started represented the contemporary mid- to late-1980s scene on the ex-Great Eastern in London. This had worked well in that it was neither the area nor the era of anyone in the group. Individual interests varied from the Great Western to London Brighton & South Coast Railway, London & South Western

We decided to enhance our experience by operating like a real railway with a dedicated signalman. He sets the route, switches the sections to a driver, and then operates the signals.

Railway to the London & North Western Railway with a bit of Lancashire & Yorkshire thrown in.

Eras varied from late-19th century to the 1960s and beyond. We wrestled with how to make best use of the interests and expertise of the various members when someone pointed out that Addison Road on the West London line saw trains from the LNWR, LSWR, GWR and LBSCR. If we picked 1908 then there was quite a lot of stock already available from group members. Others, whose interests lay

elsewhere, would be happy to build stock as a diversion from building for their own layouts.

However, Addison Road (Kensington Olympia as it became) was far too large to contemplate. At that time the club rooms were in a basement with limited scope for such a large undertaking. Also, we knew that it would take far too long to build working at a pace commensurate with the standards to which we aspired. The solution was to develop a feasible branch off the West London Line to a small but busy terminus not far from Wormwood Scrubs. The local topography was suitable, so 'Clarendon' was invented. Another important feature of the layout was that it would be a testbed for various techniques and components which would be useful for individuals' own projects. For example we have used four types of drive mechanism for the signals.

# **EDWARDIAN LONDON**

Setting the time period as Edwardian meant that some very interesting research had to be undertaken. We try to portray the scene which existed as best we can, from peoples' dress and road transport to the type of railway working that would have been seen.

Some long-distance through workings, such as the famous 'Sunny South Express', would involve replacing a locomotive with one from different company. The carriages were LNWR for the whole journey but the locomotive was changed in London so that the appropriate traction would work over its own route. This is the precedent for making locomotive changes at Clarendon, for trains having taken a short diversion down the branch from the triangular junction with the West London Line.

At the time many railway vehicles had only wooden brake blocks, and some did not have a continuous vacuum brake (such as our station pilot). Consequently trains would move at walking pace into platforms. Unfortunately, this occasionally provokes critical comment from show visitors, but we do try to educate and enlighten with our portrayal of the period scene.


Another feature of train working at the time was the re-marshalling of passenger trains, complete with passengers, part way through the journey.




# **EY DETAILS** EDWARDIAN ATMOSPHERE

As far as possible we have tried to depict an Edwardian scene. Almost all road transport relied on horse power at the time, and following helpful information from an exhibition visitor we modified the reins to be more representative of real tack. It will be noticed that virtually all people are wearing hats. Straw boaters made from waste plastic sprue and thin discs are much in evidence.

Luggage vans and through coaches would be swapped between trains, as would carriage trucks and their accompanying horseboxes. Horseboxes are marshalled at the head of the train, when occupied, for the safety and comfort of the horse.

Another point of interest and relevance to the era is the large shed in the goods yard. As most goods were moved by rail there was a lot of movement between companies so the building acted as a transhipment shed. The single line - a short-sighted lack of investment - would have been worked by staff (Webb-Thompson) so we slow the passenger trains to allow for token exchange near the signalbox. Goods trains have to stop.

The turntable is a 42' hand-operated example, typical of the era. LNWR locomotives did not work tender first, so most are turned here. Longer locomotives such as the GWR 2-8-0 have to use the triangular junction 'off-scene' at the supposed junction with the main line.

# **BUILDING FROM SCRATCH**

Many items on the layout have been kit or scratchbuilt, partly by necessity and partly because of the pleasure and satisfaction of building something which is unique. In recent years, locomotives of a suitable vintage have begun to appear and so it might be possible to see a converted RTR model in the future. Buildings are a mixture of scratchbuilt with some proprietary fittings and kits such as the excellent Howard Scenics card offerings suitably upgraded.

As the build of 'Clarendon' was nearing completion (we still have to add telegraph poles and a few locomotive shed staff), thoughts turned to a development of the line back towards the

fiddle yard/main line. With all the re-marshalling of trains, there was a need for carriage sidings. An added benefit was that all those carefully built and lined models wouldn't spend so much of their time hidden in the fiddle yard!

We also wanted a gasworks (off-stage) and accompanying exchange sidings to provide more varied goods workings. A goods loop was also a desirable feature, especially on this busy line, and

would provide more interest. Thus 'Scrubbs Lane' was devised as our current project.

Four additional boards have been built to allow the three long carriage sidings, along with the other sidings. A road overbridge hides the entrance to a fiddleyard (cassette deck) and flies over the carriage sidings. Thus the far end of the sidings and goods loop are off-stage. This means that some moves, and the far end of some carriage rakes are off-stage

# **PROTOTYPE INSPIRATION**

The prototype station at Addison Road (now Kensington Olympia) would have been an ideal location. It had trains visiting from the LNWR, LSWR, GWR and LBSCR, which covered specific interests, or the already available stock of several members of the group. However, Addison Road was considered far too large from the point of view of how long it would take us to build it, the space and cost required. It did however start us thinking that the West

London line could have had a short branch to an area near Wormwood Scrubs, which we named Clarendon.



too, keeping the fiddle yard operator busy.

So that we can operate effectively, some signals within the Scrubbs Lane 'box control area are merely repeaters displayed on the main panel, where the drivers can observe the (imaginary) arm settings. All this means that the operating sequence has to be carefully developed. The fiddleyard operator now has to operate the yard, Scrubbs Lane 'box and drive some of the trains including









# **DETAILS** LOCOMOTIVES AND STOCK

The layout was started several years ago, before the current range of excellent RTR models became available, certainly before ones of the correct period. Consequently the stock is either kit-built, such as this LBSCR Gladstone 0-4-2, or in some cases scratchbuilt. Although a few suitable items are becoming available, some of us would miss the sense of achievement and the enjoyment of actually building our own models. However, never say never!







The signalbox is made from two London

the private owner trips from the gasworks. His work has to be dovetailed with that of other operators to avoid operational delays.

# **AUTHENTIC CONTROL**

Traditional cab control had been used for 'Walford Town', with all sections switchable to either of the two controllers. The two drivers were responsible for setting their own route including the signals. The fiddleyard operator could set his area to be driven by either driver or by himself, and controlled the advance starter to advise train entry speeds.

For 'Clarendon' we decided to enhance our experience by operating more like a real railway with a dedicated signalman. The signalman sets the

route, switches the sections to a driver, and then operates the signals. Drivers must obey signals, and the only form of safety protection is the provision of catch points to protect passenger lines.

The signalman has the complete sequence, and each driver a sub-set for his own moves. The only points and section power switches controlled by the drivers are the goods sidings which are set by the equivalent of ground frames. We also have a shedmaster-cum-foreman who has complete control of the locomotive shed, and is allowed by the signalman onto the main running lines as required. Incidentally, the shed operator, being stationed at the front of the layout has an additional duty; answering questions and conversing with visitors.

Building and operating 'Clarendon' has been a very rewarding and enjoyable experience for the group, which is still firmly together despite several members having moved away from the immediate area. Certain members disappear off with measurements only to reappear weeks or months later with new items to put on train cassettes or attach to baseboards! **BRM**



# ROCO Z21 CONTROLLER

**Andy York** freely admits that he's not a DCC expert. So how user-friendly is Roco's Z21 system?

he choice of DCC systems on the market might seem bewildering, but the Roco Z21 system is something different with advantages, especially for anyone considering a new system. It's user-friendliness is an important factor. Here's how I got on with it.

#### WHAT'S IN THE BOX?

Roco's simple and stylish system box houses all of the DCC-related electronics in a compact 210mm x 150mm case, so it can be easily sited near your layout. The main purpose of the unit is to control your railway with a smartphone or tablet, but there are two X-BUS sockets to the front so you can plug-in an existing Roco multiMAUS or Lokmaus controller and use the system without a WiFi router. There's another X-BUS socket on the rear of the system box in addition to interfaces for LAN (local area network), locomotive feedback, LocoNet, CAN and Booster Bus.

The Z21 system can control 9,999 locomotive decoders and 2,048 accessory decoders and supports 'programming on the main' or on a programming track through use of a separate socket on the rear of the system. The system supports locomotive detection and feedback via the RailCom system.

Z21 is supplied with a TP Link 300Mbps Wireless N Router allowing the user to create a

wifi network to control the layout. It's a similar sort of router used for home broadband, but provides a


WiFi network to control the layout. It's a similar sort of router used for home broadband, but provides a separate network from your home's data connection. This means that multiple smartphones or tablets can be connected allowing several controllers, which is great for a club or group project where more than one operator needs to have control.

Power adaptors and leads for the Z21 and the router are supplied but come with continental

#### **SETTING UP THE Z21**

Setting up Roco's system is really simple. There's a power lead to the Z21 box and one for the router; the router and the Z21 are then joined by the network cable and that's the hardware bit done.

The Z21 is then connected to your layout's track supply by connecting the legendary two-wires to the plug inserted into the main track socket. Assuming that you've not plugged in a handset to the X-BUS you will need to

set up the WiFi to use your smartphone or tablet as a handset. Once the Z21 and router are powered up it will create a network that you can connect your 'phone or tablet to. The Z21's network will be named Z21\_WXYZ where WXYZ is the

Z21's network will be named Z21\_WXYZ where WXYZ is the final four digits of the serial number shown underneath the router. The PIN can also be

found under the router when your phone asks for it. It may be worth printing this information out on a card as your friends will certainly want to join in when they call round!

You'll need to download the Z21 App for your smartphone and free downloads are available for Android and iPhones/ iPads. As Android now accounts for 84% of all devices sold, most will head for the Google Play store - just search for Roco Z21 and install the App.



#### GETTING STARTED ON A 'PHO



Once the App is launched, head for the 'Control Panel' button that will take you to the basic controls. A few locomotives are pre-installed on the App to give you an idea of what things should look like.



If you had a locomotive set-up which shared one of the addresses of a pre-installed model all you need to do is choose it from the row of images shown at the bottom of the screen and use the touch slider control.



In the 'Locomotive Settings' menu you can start to build up your own library, giving descriptions of your own locomotive stable including using your own images from your 'phone or tablet's camera. You can really go to town on giving descriptive information. If you use more than one device or have fellow operators you can export the settings to them.

The chances are that you'll have to set up your own locomotive and that's where the Z21 shines in presentation terms above other DCC systems.

The graphic interface just makes everything so much easier to use. You don't necessarily need to remember locomotive decoder numbers any more, something that large fleet owners will rejoice at.

From starting the app, to taking a photograph of a locomotive and assigning it all the details, it was all carried out in a few minutes, and it only needs doing once.

Once you've set up your locomotive the on-screen functionality is brilliant! The speedstep slider is intuitive and a joy to use and it's far easier having a graphic representation of the functions of the decoder to control lights and sounds if installed on your model.

#### WHAT ELSE WILL THE Z21 DO?

The Z21 won't quite make tea, but it will do everything else you're likely to need from a good DCC system. You can read CV values when the programming track is plugged in and re-program them accordingly. You can program 'on the main' too but you don't get any validation responses. If you install the App on a tablet you can even control two locomotives and their functions at the same time.

If you take overhead images of your layout you can overlay graphic interpretations of points and accessory decoders. These can then be changed with a simple tap of the screen. And, if you're using a tablet you can control the model on one side and the accessory decoders on the other. Don't worry if you don't have a tablet; a simple swipe to the side lets you toggle between loco and accessory screens in the blink of an eye.

Roco have prepared graphic interpretations of several European locomotives that can be downloaded and you can tap the controls on the screen to use the functions.

#### **REAL TIME VIEW OF YOUR RAILWAY**

Roco produces locomotives with a camera discreetly installed in the cab which gives a drivers-eye view of the railway. When combined with the cab control layout it gives an immersive experience quite unlike anything we've seen before.





#### THE Z21 IN BRIEF

Some of the Z21 content may seem gimmicky to the purist but if the system can captivate returnees or newcomers to the hobby then that's a good thing. You don't need all those bells and whistles. The Z21 can operate a layout within a few seconds, and, you'll find it more difficult to keep your friends away from the layout as they can join in too.

Whilst a 'newbie' will take to the system faster than the endless button pressing on a conventional system, an experienced DCC user moving up from an earlier system will find the programming in particular a joy. If you don't have a smartphone it's worth getting a cheap handset for this alone!

I love the wireless aspect, it's genuinely the most enjoyable control system I've ever used and a stand-out innovation of the last year.

The price tag may put some off, but it's not much more than a decent alternative package, even if the difference means you buy one less locomotive next year - it will be worth it!

He started the process with strips of paper to represent the trains, and used them to position all the trains that will be running. The trains and train formations were determined through research and personal memories.

Moving strips of paper around may seem oldfashioned - but it works. There does not appear to be a computer programme that replicates this method with the same ease and simplicity of use. By moving paper instead of trains, any conflicting movements were avoided without the inevitable crashes. Having a proper timetable ensures that all the trains end up in their original starting positions. It makes it easier at the start of exhibitions and extra moves can be inserted into the running programme, so long as the extra train is returned to its starting position.

The control panels were defined by painting the baseboard edges. Blue = UP; red = DOWN; green = MAIN. These can be seen in the timetable (left).

#### **COMPROMISES**

One drawback of choosing a location before having total knowledge of the layout was that the storage provision is equally divided between the two. In the case of the Central Wales Line and the Welsh Marches line this was never going to be the case. Over time, as there is scope to add more trains, this imbalance will become less noticeable. The other major compromise, particularly to those who know the line is that the original chosen directions of travel - Up and Down - are opposite to that of the

The first decision was to designate the spur sidings; that between roads 4 and 5 was named 'Swansea', which is the ultimate destination of the Central Wales Line. The other, between roads 12 and 13, is now known as 'Shrewsbury' (although it also doubles as 'Wenlock'). This latter has in-built isolation so that two trains can be accommodated.

The basis of the timetable is that each train moves and returns to the same storage road. The only exception being the DMU, which shuttles between Swansea and Shrewsbury spurs.

So where to begin? On past layouts it has proved to be a good ploy to have some stock on the front of the layout at the beginning of the running session. In this way even if things mysteriously go wrong behind the scenes there is something to keep the punter happy. In this instance we start with a ballast train on the rear loop and the Class 122 railcar in the bay platform.

The next step was to accommodate the factual passenger trains: the five/six coach Mk 1 stopping trains from Cardiff to Crewe and return, hauled in the first part of the 1980s by steam-heat Class 25's and later by Class 33s. There were at this time still through expresses to and from Manchester to the West Country. As we had additional capacity on the Central Wales Line we then invented a Swansea to Hereford movement, worked by Class 47 (we were reliably informed!). As well as the regular DMU movement noted previously we added the modeller's licence movement from Stokesay to Wenlock and return. We then added steam specials, which were a well-known feature of the line in the 1980s. In the Up direction we have a good representation of the 'Welsh Marches Pullman', whilst in the Down direction we have a Hereford to Swansea steam special with a prolonged stop at Stokesay so

passengers can take an additional

trip to Wenlock. This allows the locomotive to take water from a set of tanks stabled on the short siding from Down loop 2.



**HOW TO** MODEL...

## AROCK FACE CUTTING



ock faces are very handy on a model railway. While the prototype tried to avoid blasting its way through the countryside, we are often faced with a need to bring lumpy hillsides and flat trackbeds together and so a steep cutting is necessary. Producing a realistic model of one can be another matter altogether.

American modellers love their mountains and cliffs even more than we do, so it's no surprise to see a brand new product appear in the Woodland Scenics range to make life easier in this respect.

'Shaper Sheet' is an ingenious foil-backed cloth on a roll that can be bent and creased as required. The thick foil ensures it has strength and retains its shape.

Simply screwing a sheet up and then unfolding it will make a presentable cliff face. For those who really know their geology, it ought to be possible to poke and prod the sheets into recognisable rock faces.

Once shaped, the sheet is covered in plaster to provide a suitable surface for the paint and also to allow further sculpting as required. A plaster skin will remove the flexibility of the sheet, although some sort of supporting structure is necessary - the sheets are self-supporting, but aren't that strong.

The plaster can be sculpted easily with a dental pick or other sharp object. Experience shows that two of more layers of plaster make this easier as you need a bit of depth for the crevices to look right.

The following little project will test the materials mentionned and hopefully produce a neat diorama to display and photograph O gauge models.

With this in mind, I've chosen to represent a siding at the base of a cliff. The track is ballasted with fine stones that are a good representation of the sort of poor ballast employed on little-used sidings.

The finished model is 50cm long and just over 20cm tall. This leaves me with two-thirds of the roll of shaper sheet to play with, over half

a box of plaster and nearly all the earth colour pigments - a pretty

# PRACTICAL BRIDE

### STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE



To support the rock face I carved up some 4" thick polystyrene. My Proxxon hot wire cutter made quick, and not too smelly, work of this. A bread knife or saw would work just as well, but be a lot messier.



A pretty basic shape is sufficient as all the fine detail is provided by the shaper sheet material and plaster.



To smooth the rock face a little and add some strata, I dragged a damp brush over the surface, trying to keep the lines horizontal. if you keep washing the bristles as you work the effect left is a lot like sandstone. Leave to dry overnight.



The Woodland Scenics' Earth Colors kit contains eight pigment bottles and a foam brush.



Finally, shading is provided with a wash of black. If the result looks too dark, spray the area with salty water and the paint fades.



The Peco O gauge track was ballasted with fine grey ballast. I found that simply tapping the rails was enough to settle it in place with only a little to brush off the sleeper tops.



Undiluted Scenic Cement is ideal for fixing the ballast in place, but I found that despite the wetting agents within it, a drop of washing up liquid was needed to reduce the surface tension.



The ballast looked too clean for a siding so I worked brown emulsion paint, slightly thinned, into it. Just splodge the colours around randomly and let them mix. If newer ballast is your aim then the Earth Colors will be enough to tint the stones.



A mix of two colours of electrostatic grass covered the ground surfaces. On its own, the green is too strong but mixed with varying amounts of beige, the result is more varied and natural.



The finishing touch was some water in the gulley between the track and cliff face. A few drops of Ronseal Yacht varnish was enough for this.



Shaper Sheet is a foil-backed cloth material. Simply cut a length slightly longer than required, screw it up and then flatten it out again. The sheet is then bent over the polystyrene and fixed with 'No More Nails' PVA glue.



Although you can use the cloth surface on its own, the best idea is to cover it with WS Carving Plaster. This needs to be mixed well before using. I aimed for a texture akin to double cream - thick, but spreadable.



Junk mail often includes flexible plastic cards which I hang on to for jobs like this. Any flexible plastic will do though and scrapers can be cut from waste packing material.



Before use, the pigments have to be thinned in water. One part pigment to 15 to 30 parts water is about right. More water just results in a lighter colour.



Pick a couple of base colours; raw umber and slate grey in this case, and dab them randomly over the rock surface letting the colours run and blend on the plaster.



Once dry, the rock face should be sealed with Scenic Cement sprayed from a hand pump or airbrush. I used an empty shower cleaner spray bottle that had been well washed out.



Lichen is a natural product that has fallen out of favour in recent years. But, it's still good stuff and great for model bushes. Just tear off suitably sized clumps from the larger lump.




A dab of Scenic Glue or PVA was enough to hold the bushes in place at the foot of the cliff.



A squirt of hair lacquer followed by a sprinkle of flock powder finished the job. I used a mix of Blended Turf and Turf on the diorama. A restrained palette of colours looks more natural.









Above The transit shed was added when an extra board was inserted to give a longer run out of the station and greater justification for running trip freights. Local pilot 08630 shunts a Heljan Cargowaggon into the unloading bay and will return with the VDA van on the right. The shed itself has a concrete base and sheet metal structure, all built up around a PVC foam shell clad in Plastikard sheeting. The excellent security fencing is a PH Designs etched brass product.

ehind every good layout, there should be a clear concept as to what we are trying to achieve as modellers. Naturally those objectives will be different for each of us, given restraints on space, budget or time, for example. For me, the concept behind 'Airthrey Park' has always been clear, namely to develop a highstandard modern image layout to recall the halcyon days of the mid-1980s in Scotland, allowing me to operate and exhibit the stock which I so enjoy preparing.

The logic behind 'AP', as the layout is normally known, is that it is the terminus of a short branch serving Stirling University, which lies a few miles to the north of Stirling and where I studied for my first degree in the 1990s. The name comes from the university's medical centre. This background gives justification to the traffic that can be operated, with passenger services to Glasgow and Edinburgh and mail and sleeper services extended from Stirling. Freight trip workings serve the transit shed and depot. Given the number of terminating services, it would be natural for AP to replace servicing facilities at Stirling, so a small locomotive and DMU maintenance depot and fuel point feature, along with coaching stock sidings.

Both the layout and stock that operate on it have benefitted from developments over the last decade or so, with DCC operation and sound-fitted stock. Given that my main interest is in the building, detailing and repainting of almost any kind of stock, turnover of the fleet reflects the improving quality and variation of RTR products and kits, as well as (I hope!), my own developing abilities.

#### **BACKGROUND**

'Airthrey Park' started life back in 2001, initially constructed within the size restraints of the garage of my home at the time in Porto, northern Portugal. The aim was largely just to house my model fleet, with baseboards, tracklaying and some basic scenery completed before the layout was moved to the UK in 2003. Whilst my principal interest is rolling stock my father, Malcolm, is undoubtedly the scenic specialist and it is he who has completed all of the track, ballasting, buildings, scenic works and overall features to a very high

standard. He was assisted in completing the layout by Jeff Paterson (baseboards), Jim Reid (DCC wiring) and Simon Barratt at Stirling & Clackmannanshire Model Railway Club, with the initial exhibition appearance coming at Ayr in September 2007.

Since then, the layout has made a couple of exhibition appearances each year, mostly in Scotland as well as a few in England, highlighting the interest in modelling the

are just as important as the main structures, making a significant contribution to the overall feeling and look of the scene. Given this, suitable signage was created for the station platforms, entrances and around the depot as well as adding other details such as signal cable trunking. Care has been taken to install various figures on the station platform, whilst the lack of staff around the depot and fuelling points is notable, a fact supported by hundreds of prototypical depot photographs in which no-one appears. Presumably the staff tearoom is crowded as a result! Similar attention has been given to the selection and location of suitable period vehicles positioned at places around the layout. In a similar vein, various lighting units from Express Models were installed where

suitable and subtle illumination was required, including the depot building interior along with exterior lights along the main walls. Signals and ground signals, all from the Traintronics range, were also installed with these being manually

controlled from the main panel.

Scottish rail scene during this classic period. Given the logistics of me attending shows, having lived in Lisbon for the past ten years, over-exposure of AP at exhibitions has never been an issue and it remains a popular at shows.

I must note that much of my enthusiasm for this era comes from my friendship with the late Andrew Elliott, a regular contributor to railway modelling magazines from the late-1980s onwards and to whom the layout is dedicated. Andy encouraged me to start detailing and repainting my stock and whilst we collaborated on many projects, his sad passing in 2006 meant that he could not appreciate the work that he has inspired.

#### **GETTING THE BASICS RIGHT**

AP features six 'four-by-two' boards, giving an overall size of 7.5m x 0.6m, with four scenic sections and two fiddleyard boards, forming three pairs of boards which can be bolted together for storage and transport. This is not the original format, as longer fiddleyard boards were constructed after the move to the UK and an additional scenic section added in 2010, housing the freight transit shed and giving greater space around the depot area.

Peco Code 75 track and points are used, with track ballasted using a mix of fine ballast and cinders from the Woodland Scenics range, after wiring had been installed. Of note are the points, all of which have had reliability improvements undertaken, namely the common crossing (frog) being insulated on all four rails, being fed by power from a microswitch fitted to the point motor.

To maintain current continuity, mainly due to the ingress of dirt or dust between the rail/blades, three wires are soldered across the hinge by the point heel rail onto the stock rail. In addition, point blades are electrically bonded with the stock rails to eliminate short circuits, frequently caused by out-of-gauge wheelsets touching both simultaneously. Such improvements are important, especially with the Class 08 shunters which otherwise have a tendency to become gapped on imperfect points. Traditional DC wiring and control is used for points, signals and lighting with a conventional operator's control panel behind the layout.

From the outset, the layout has been wired for DCC operation, using a Lenz TR150 power supply and LH100 handsets, making the most of the greater operational flexibility and significant developments in DCC sound over the last decade.

A layout such as AP really highlights the benefits from DCC, where the 'close-up sound environment' can be appreciated, given the multitude of shunting operations and locomotive start-ups. Indeed, so that operators can appreciate the experience, additional DCC controller sockets are fitted on the layout front, using an 'Xpressnet' loom linked to the base control panel. This also permits greater interaction with viewers at shows, allowing conversation and discussion as opposed to shouting from behind the layout, which is partly hidden behind the

More practically, given that the three-link or screw couplings on locomotives and stock are actually used to haul trains, hooking on and off is considerably easier from the layout front. At shows, one operator usually acts as controller, setting routes and signals from the main panel, along with two drivers, each with a DCC handset for running trains on the scenic section. A fourth operator is normally given responsibility for the fiddleyard, preparing and marshalling trains, testing stock or cleaning wheels, in between fetching coffee for the other operators!

The maintenance shed is the flagship structure, and it even caught the eye of Hornby which used it as inspiration for one of its 'Skaledale' diesel sheds! Whilst not an exact copy, it takes its concept and many features from Haymarket depot servicing shed in Edinburgh. The shed is long enough to accommodate a three-car DMU or a trio of locomotives on each of the two roads, with additional stabling space either side.

These two stabling sidings are often used for departmental stock, such as snowploughs, a breakdown tool van or a variety of On-Track Plant, produced by Jim Reid. The addition of an extra scenic board allowed inclusion of a new depot amenity block and freight transit shed in a matching architectural style to the main depot building.



The twin-road fuelling point and adjacent oil storage tanks use elements of the prototypes from Ayr and Inverness and have sufficient clearance for both locomotives and DMUs to be refuelled. Access between depot and fuel point is via a separate loop to that which surrounds the station island platform, thus interest can be maintained at shows with locomotives moving around the depot area, whilst trains arrive or depart from the platform lines. To the front of the platform lines are two DMU and coaching stock stabling sidings, along with a short siding in which the station pilot usually resides.

#### **BUILDINGS**

The main buildings were built using my father's individual, but highly effective methods based on expanded rigid PVC plastic sheet of varying thicknesses of up to 5mm. These basic frames were then decorated with patterned Slater's Plastikard and Wills material sheets for the walls and roofs, with windows and doors then cut out of the assembled shells. Evergreen styrene strip and sheet were used for windows and doors as well as other features such as guttering and handrails. Given access was needed to some building interiors, for subsequent installation of lighting for example, roofs were built as separate units for the larger buildings, again using Slater's corrugated sheet on a foam PVC structure. Final finishing in the case of flat roofs used a coat of fine cinder scatter material or tile arout to replicate rough bitumen, before being fixed to the walls once any internal details had been added.

For the station platforms, PVC foam was used to form the edges, with each 'block' made by scoring marks into the soft foam material. The various elements of the




Haymarket's dual-braked 26029 trundles into the platform loop with an engineers train formed of kit-built 'Grampus' wagons. Noticeable in the background is the low relief backscene featuring different layers and depths of retaining walls, buildings and trees to give a convincing 3-D effect.


footbridge and lift tower were built using Plastikard, along with Evergreen styrene strip for the bridge panelling effects plus Slater's corrugated sheet for the tower. A similar method was used for the section of roadbridge which forms the scenic break to the fiddleyard, with a coating of light grey ceramic tile grout applied to re-create the concrete surfaces, weathered with diluted washes of watercolour paints.

Elsewhere, to create varying degrees of surface roughness, fine cinders scatter material and grey tile grout were applied to the station platform surface and roads, whilst all finished surfaces then had several colour washes applied, using a mix of brown, grey and black where appropriate. In order to produce that prototypical, weathered appearance, a range of weathering powders were applied to all of the buildings, roads and other









features, whilst both the ballast and surrounding ground around the fuelling and stabling points required a wash of matt black paint to represent deposits of oil.

#### **MOTIVE POWER**

The dateline is set on 1985/86, so both the motive power and rolling stock reflects what could reasonably have been expected to run in central Scotland at the time. Most of the locomotives, units and coaching stock are my own work, accompanied by some excellent kit-built wagons from Simon Barratt, who also fitted sound decoders and speakers, along with an eclectic mix of engineering stock produced by Jim Reid.

The selection of locomotives includes many personal favourites which fit into the time period and bring back memories of particular events or journeys. All stock has full bufferbeam detailing with working three-link or screw-link couplings, wire handrails, roof fans, flush glazing, windscreen wipers and such like, with full repaints and appropriate weathering, applied with an airbrush, dry-brushing or weathering powders. All of the locomotives and units have ESU Loksound

decoders, either V3.5 or V4.0, with South West Digital or LegomanBiffo programming, unless noted.

The Class o8 depot pilots are based on factory sound-fitted Hornby examples, with the chips reblown. It's not easy to fit sound to '08s', hence the use of factory equipped examples, with bodies exchanged with non-sound examples to obtain the correct arrangement of tool boxes and cab doors. Generally to be found stabled outside the depot is former Markinch inmate, 06003, the only Andrew Barclay Class o6 survivor.

A couple of pairs of Bachmann Class 20s feature, all with sound chips reblown by Howes of Oxford, which are considered to be the best, especially for slow speed running and shunting. The disc headcode pair are based on Bachmann's 20028, with Scottish-style deeper cabside windows, but with the cabside tablet catcher recesses filled in, whilst oddball 20228 is depicted with its rebuilt nose-end without headcode box. Various unrefurbished and refurbished examples of newer Bachmann Class 37 releases include such classic machines as Eastfield's 37012 Loch Rannoch and 37188 Jimmy Shand.

Locos with ESU v4.0 decoders and LegomanBiffo

programming include an excellent function for the Spirax air valves 'clicking' off – anyone who has wandered around a depot full of stabled diesels will know exactly this sound and the atmosphere created inside an otherwise quiet shed environment!

One subject which frequently comes up for discussion is the use of Heljan Class 47s on AP. Discussion as to the best '47' model is a well-exercised debate on forums, but for me, the Heljan example captures the prototype look much better than the others available, even if some improvements are required such as etched roof fans and the body width issue. The fleet is currently being upgraded with Shawplan/Extreme Etchings cab front window surrounds, along with Laserglaze side windows, with the original glazing retained on the cab front windows. The locomotives modelled cover the kaleidoscope of liveries prevalent in 1985/86, from standard blue to ScotRail, plus a few oddities.

Without doubt the most popular locos on AP are our Heljan Class 26s and 27s, which even in 1985/86 still played a significant role on Scotland's railways. Virtually every variation is covered, including a trio of

derived Class 120 set and a BRCW Class 104 converted from a Hornby Class 110, produced by Andy Elliott. The '120' is a former Inverness set with extended van area and the three-car '104' set features a rare Trailer Brake Second (TBS) sandwiched between two DMSL vehicles. Ironically, the DMSL vehicles are both unpowered, with the centre trailer car housing a modified Bachmann Class 108 power unit in the van area.

Given the various spare Bachmann vehicles, a scratch set can also been made up, featuring a Class 105 DMBS in combination with a '107' centre car and any type of DMSL vehicle available. The Ayr depot fire and Class 107 axle crisis led to ScotRail to deploy any and every type of DMU vehicle it could obtain during much of 1986, including Class 104s, 105s and 120s, something which we can replicate on AP with ease, given DMU sets are fitted with intermediate Kadee couplings. Several more oddball units also feature, such as an MTK-derived Class 140 railbus and Test Car Iris, the RTC's Derby Lightweight railcar, whilst the most recent addition to the fleet is three-car prototype Sprinter 150 001, which ran trials in Scotland during 1985/86.

Most coaches and wagons are detailed and weathered RTR items, supplemented by kit or scratchbuilt wagons, all of which have been suitably dirtied, loaded and re-wheeled as required. Mixed parcels rakes feature

Bachmann Mk 1 BGs and GUVs along with kit-built ex-SR CCTs and BGs plus a Travelling Post Office set using a single Hurst models sorting van. The ScotRail push-pull set is formed of a much-modified and improved DC Kits Mk 2f DBSO, accompanied by repainted and detailed Dapol Mk 2d stock and the odd air-braked Mk 2z TSO.

A range of air-braked freight stock serves the transit shed and depot, whilst almost anything departmental can justifiably appear, but there are no fixed rakes or regular workings. Departmental stock includes a BTU breakdown coach, Britannia Pacific ZZV snowploughs along with any of Jim Reid's excellent fleet of On-Track Plant.

#### MISSION ACCOMPLISHED?

As with most layouts, AP probably cannot ever be regarded as complete. That said, I think that the objective of creating a high-quality layout of the mid-1980s Scottish Region scene has been successfully accomplished, especially given the positive comments and feedback received wherever AP has been exhibited. Finally, and no less important, is recognition for all of those who have assisted with completing the layout and exhibiting AP at various shows over the last few years. The layout has built up a nice group of followers and friends with a similar interest in modelling the Scottish rail scene and I look forward to the next exhibition outing. **BRM** 

#### **KEY DETAILS** WORKING WITH DCC



Experience of using DCC sound has led to a range of improvements in terms of speakers, whilst improved program tracks provided by Bryan Robertson have replaced older or factory versions. Factory sound projects are often too fast for generally low speed operations which feature on AP, so modifications to CV settings for start/stop/acceleration have been made so that locomotives and units move off more slowly and accelerate more like the real thing. In addition, bigger and better speakers have been fitted where possible, with DCC Supplies bass enhanced and bass reflex speakers being used in many models. Another tip is to always seal the back of a speaker, with Butyl 'Blak-Tak' being an ideal substance, combined with noting the acoustics of each type of model. For example, some locomotives produce better effects with speakers positioned to project sound upwards, such as Heljan Class 47s, whereas others are better captured by downward mounted speakers.

Good preparation of locomotives and stock before shows is also essential, especially with many new models seeming to suffer from an excess of factory-applied grease and insufficient contacts between pick-ups and wheelsets. Normally, when locomotives are being sound-fitted the opportunity is taken to strip down the bogies, base plates and wheelsets to allow degreasing of the gear train and wheelsets using methylated spirit.

unrefurbished disc-fitted '26s' based on the first releases, each heavily rebuilt to bring them up to mid-1980s state with tablet catcher recesses and cab door windows plated over. The last unrefurbished '26/1s' just lasted into 1986, so could just be seen alongside the first Class 37/4s in traffic, whilst the refurbished Class 26s include both '26/0' and '26/1' variants.

The Class 27 fleet has also undergone improvements to the cab fronts and underframe tanks, especially on the '27/1' former push-pull examples, whilst a more drastic rebuild was undertaken on former ETH-fitted 27059, with extra bodyside and roof grilles, underframe trunking and modified fuel tanks. These sound-fitted fleets create what is definitely the AP soundtrack - namely Sulzer 6LDA engines chuntering away happily!


#### **UNITS & ROLLING STOCK**

Popular as the locomotives are, DMUs are just as important to any ScR layout set in the mid-1980s. Our fleet includes a pair of three-car Class 107s, based on the Bachmann Class 108 with the DMBS cars rebuilt with the correct door and window arrangement on the guard's section. This was accomplished by cutting out a section of each side incorporating the guard's door and one window, then re-inserting it on the opposite side. Admittedly, it is not easy to successfully re-insert the sections and obtain a smooth finish, but like most jobs, it can be done with a bit of skill and patience; the reward being that you have a correct Class 107 and not a '108' imposter!

Also used are a Lima/Hornby Class 101, DC Kits

# PRACTICAL

HOW TO...



### **Howard Smith** embarks on a model transformation to raise funds for the new-build P2 class locomotive. And, you'll be able to buy it.

ome wasn't built in a day goes the proverb, and neither is a brandnew steam locomotive. Having successfully campaigned for, funded and built Pacific A1 class Tornado, the very same team behind its creation is now not only operating Tornado, but has turned its attention to resurrect another LNER locomotive design from the past.

The P2 Steam Locomotive Company plans to build a brand-new member of the extinct P2 class.

And, work to build locomotive number seven of the once six-strong P2 class has already begun. To date, the frames have been cut and assembled, and the wheels have been cast too.

The project is certainly in the hands of a capable team with a successful track record, but, like all projects on such a monumental scale, they cost money, and a fair amount of it! The total cost to get P2 No. 2007 *Prince of Wales* built and operational is an estimated £5m - and the majority will be raised via generous donations from members of the public.

Time is of the essence too - *Tornado* took 18 years to build, and some who donated never got to see it run. Every little amount of money raised helps.

This got me thinking. If I create a super-detailed OO gauge model of *Prince of Wales*, we'll hold our very own **BRM** sealed bid auction. The winning bidder becomes the owner of a new model and all proceeds from the auction will be donated to the P2 project. The higher the bid, the more money the P2 Steam Locomotive Company will receive, and the real locomotive will exist just that little bit sooner.



Left A rear view of the Hornby P2, minus its tender reveals the plain cab interior with unpainted gauges. This needs decorating and a crew. More importantly though, if you look beneath the frames, the wheels on the pony truck are flangeless. They have to go, and whilst I'm at it, I'll replace all the wheels with some that have the correct all-steel tyre depth.

Right Good, but could be better. The front of the Railroad Hornby P2 is loosely detailed, but lacks the level of finesse that I'm after. Areas such as the handrails, smokebox dart and lamp brackets are all moulded into the smokebox door. I want this model of Prince of Wales to stand out and look better than a standard 'out of the box' model, so I've sourced some superior brass equivalents.







#### The 'TO DO' list

- Separate body from chassis
- Swap P2 tender for A1 tender
- Remove moulded handrails from tender and locomotive body
- Commission new wheels
- Make new handrails
- Obtain a set of nameplates
- Fit new hoses and couplings
- Replace plastic valvegear
- Petail and paint the cab interior
- Fit sprung buffers
- Repaint the locomotive
- Add real coal to the tender
- Paint and fit a cab crew
- Add lamps and a whistle
- Line the locomotive
- Fit a cab/tender roof cover
- Find a suitable presentation box

When embarking on a project I usually put one of these lists together. I find it helps calculate both the cost and time that I'm prepared to dedicate to it. It's all too easy to get carried away and overspend!



Above The moulded handrails to the rear of the tender and locomotive have been removed and replaced with much better brass equivalents.

These can be sourced from a variety of suppliers, Nairnshire Modelling Supplies, Eileen's Emporium or Markits for example. Removal of unwanted plastic is quick with a scalpel, but use it very carefully to avoid damaging the surrounding plastic and always cut away from you.


Left The vacuum hoses were carefully removed and replaced with a pair of brass and phosphor bronze items. In addition, air hoses are also fitted as per *Tornado*,

an essential item for main line running in the 21st century. I use surplus air hoses supplied with RTR diesel models in an accessory bag.




# COCK O THE NO.

Once the old plastic and moulded handrails are removed, new holes are drilled with a miniature pin vice. It's a precaution more than anything else - one slip with an electric drill could ruin the side of the locomotive.







Nothing emulates brass parts as well as real brass itself. The plastic whistle on the Hornby model is ousted and replaced with this item from DMR Products. A 2mm diameter hole is drilled with a pin vice to fit the new replacement. Once the rest of the locomotive has been painted, it'll polish up nicely.

#### **DETAILING THE CAB**

The number of detailed and weathered locomotives that run on layouts without a crew is surprising. It's a simple process and yet one that's often overlooked. Good figures really help to set a model off. This nice whitemetal locomotive crew

Castings (ref:





MSV21) is perfect. One figure is perched on the window ledge, whilst the other is captured leaning out, looking down at the track. Two coal shovels are also supplied.

# LOCOMOTIVE PROFILE: LNER P2 2-8-2

## William Ascough of the LNER Study Circle chronicles the short, but eventful lives of these magnificent Gresley 'Mikados'.


erbert Nigel Gresley designed his
A1 'Pacifics' in 1922; by 1928 these
locomotives had proven a great success,
enabling the LNER to accelerate its
schedules and run heavier express
trains between London and Edinburgh. However, the
loads they could command further northwards were
limited. Accordingly, attention turned to the design of

a locomotive to specifically meet the requirements of the Edinburgh-Aberdeen route, able to haul 530ton expresses without assistance.

The resulting design emerged from Doncaster Works in May 1934. It was a magnificent 2-8-2 given the evocative name *Cock o' the North* and numbered 2001 in commemoration of the first British express passenger 4-6-0, built for the North Eastern Railway in 1899.

The new locomotive was classified P2 by the LNER and introduced to the nation in a blaze of publicity as the most powerful express locomotive in Great Britain. The new design had been developed from the 'Pacifics' using a larger boiler and firebox but retaining the three-cylinder Gresley arrangement. No. 2001 also incorporated several innovative features including a double blastpipe of the Kylchap type, an ACFI feed water







heater and Lentz poppet valves driven by a rotary cam valve gear shaft from the second driving axle.

It was also fitted with smoke deflectors integral with the front of the boiler giving it a modern, almost European appearance which had been developed following wind tunnel experiments.

After running in Scotland for a week it came back south for trials and testing on the Great Northern (GN) main line where it stayed until the end of July 1934 when it went back north, to work between Edinburgh and Dundee. Due to the many innovations in the design, a number of problems arose. Adjustments were made to the blastpipe tops but the problems were not fully resolved. It was then decided to send the locomotive to the Vitry test plant in France for further trials. These were not entirely successful and the locomotive returned for further modifications. With so many new features in the design, the problems were not completely solved and Cock o' the North was eventually rebuilt with a Bugatti-style streamlined front end and brought into line with the subsequent locomotives of the class.

Within about five months, a second locomotive had appeared from Doncaster to the same general design but having piston valves and Gresley's derived valve gear similar to his 'Pacific' locomotives and the P1 heavy goods 2-8-2s. Named *Earl Marischal*, No. 2002 took up its duties in Scotland after a short period running-in from Doncaster.

Four further 2-8-2s similar to 2002 were outshopped in 1936 - Nos. 2003-06 - and these locomotives were built to a slightly modified design following further wind tunnel experiments which resulted in the incorporation of the Bugatti-type smokebox developed in 1935 for the A4s.

From the 1935 summer timetable, P2s were found working express passenger trains between Edinburgh and Aberdeen and became a rare sight away from Scotland. Once all six locomotives were available they were also used on express goods and fish trains.

#### IN SERVICE

When new, the first and second P2s were regularly seen on test and running-in workings on the Great Northern main line into King's Cross. Similarly, as the later locomotives were built they were also noted at King's Cross and Doncaster on a few occasions

Later, Nos. 2001 and 2004 were allocated to Edinburgh Haymarket whilst Nos. 2002 and 2006 generally worked from Aberdeen Ferryhill, although No. 2002 spent its first year at Dundee. The regular locomotives working from Dundee were Nos. 2003 and 2005. They were diagrammed to take loads of up to 530 tons unassisted on express passenger services between Edinburgh and Aberdeen and 550 tons between Edinburgh and Glasgow.

#### **PROTOTYPE INSPIRATION**

Duties to Aberdeen usually involved a change of locomotive at Dundee, although locomotives would sometimes work right through from Edinburgh to Aberdeen. The Aberdeen locomotives were also rostered to express meat and fish trains heading south from that city.

#### DETAILS

Initially, the cabs fitted to Nos. 2001/02 had a low cut-out in line with the bottom of the cab windows. Fold down crew seats without backs were fitted and, when new, there were initially no ventilators in the roof. Beading was fitted around the cab edge with short cab access handrails only 3' 7" high. The side sheets were curved inwards to match their tenders. Bucket cab seats with backs were later fitted and the cut-out on the cab of *Cock o' the North* was raised early in 1935 to the same height as the tender and the handrail lengthened to match the tender at a height of 4' 3". Similar alterations were made to No. 2002 but these do not appear to have been completed until this locomotive was streamlined in 1936.

The cabs of the later locomotives, Nos. 2003-06, had the high cut-out when built and the side sheets were straight without any beading. Cab handrails were noticeably taller - at 4' 6" - than the handrail on the tender. They were also initially without ventilators in the roof except for No. 2006 which had them from new. These ventilators were later fitted to all the streamlined locomotives as were the bucket seats.

The first two locomotives were similar in that the boiler cladding was continued forward along the side of the smokebox in the form of smoke deflectors. After running for six months No. 2002 *Earl Marischal* was fitted with additional smoke deflectors outside the original plates. These were left *in situ* but cut back by 12".

All six P2s were fitted with the Crosby tri-note chime whistle similar to those later fitted to the A4 Class.

The class was fitted with Spencer-Moulton buffers on the front and Group Standard buffers on the tenders. However, the distinctive shape of the front buffers was hidden behind the casing of the streamlined locomotives.





#### **BOILERS AND FIREBOXES**

P2s were fitted with Diagram 106 boilers, similar to the 'Pacific' type but with a larger firebox and a grate area of 50 sq. ft. Left-hand drive was standard and the vacuum ejector pipe was fitted to this side of the boiler. It is understood that the boiler fitted to the last locomotive – No. 2006 Wolf of Badenoch - had a an extended combustion chamber between the boiler and the firebox such that the distance between the tubeplates was reduced by 1'. This feature can be easily picked out on photographs of No. 2006.

#### **FOOTPLATES & TENDERS**

The footplate of No. 2001 was level from the firebox to the front of the smokebox. The footplating on No. 2002 was 2" higher than No. 2001, but swept down over the cylinders (similar to the 'Pacifics') to the level of the front frames. The footplating of the streamlined locomotives swept down from the rear of the cylinders to the front bufferbeam in the same way as the A4s and also featured non-slip tread plates

The first two locomotives had tenders of the highsided non-corridor type similar to those attached to the A3 'Super Pacifics'. These were self-trimming 5,000gal tenders carrying 8ton of coal.

The tender fitted to *Cock o' the North* had spoked wheels of 4' 2" diameter whereas *Earl Marischal* had

solid disc wheels of the same size. These tenders had a front shield and bulkhead fitted to the same height as the rear of the tender (7' 10"). There was a noticeable beading rail at the top of the sides on these two tenders and the front side sheet turned inwards to meet the cab.


The last four locomotives had streamlined non-corridor tenders with flush sides and fairings fitted at the front end. There was no beading rail on these tenders and at the front end the side sheets remained straight to match the cabs of the locomotives. These four tenders had a high front shield 8' 61/4" high and fairings fitted similar to the A4 non-corridor tenders. The bulkhead at the rear of the coal bunker was 8' 31/2" high. Fairings were fitted behind this bulkhead around the tank filler although these were all later removed after which the coal capacity on these tenders was given as 9ton.

#### **LIVERIES**

Nos. 2001/02 were painted in LNER apple green express passenger livery with black and white lining and black frames. Numbers and lettering on the tender were gold and shaded. The streamlined locomotives were given a similar livery which finished at the front, where the smokebox was painted black, separated by a parabolic curve of white/black/white lining. BRIM

# ESSENTIALLY MANAGEMENT OF THE PROPERTY OF THE

The modern railway bristles with lineside equipment, but what does it do, and how can it be re-created in model form? Network Rail engineer *Simon Paley* reveals all.



odellers are often heard to say that it's the 'little details that bring a model to life' and introduce atmosphere. However, many modern layouts lack miniature versions of the masses of boxes, devices and signage that litter the contemporary railway. The aim of this article is help you understand what those items do and how to model them.

#### **LINESIDE ITEMS**

There are many hundreds of lineside details that need to be incorporated into a scene on a Modern layout. The view below, taken at the east end of Reading station, shows a typical array of equipment cabinets and details found around stations and junctions.

The large cabinets in the centre of the photograph (1) are 'Location Cabinets' containing control and telecoms equipment for signals and points. These are available from many sources, Hornby, Bachmann, Knightwing, Wills and Ten Commandments in 4mm scale, Ratio and N Brass Locos (2mm), Ten Commandments (2/4/7mm) and Knightwing (2/4mm).

The smaller boxes on posts (2) are housings to protect the electrical connections for points, Automatic Warning System (AWS) ramps and other on track equipment. This type of equipment is not available readymade, but they can be easily scratchbuilt from plastic and bits from your scrapbox.

An all-important detail that can be seen in real life, but not often on models are Point Operating Mechanisms. Nowadays these consist of either hand throws, mechanical HW type motors or hydraulic clamp lock mechanisms. Point handles are produced by several manufacturers in different scales, while the HW Motors are available from Peco (in 4mm scale), N Brass Locos for 2mm scale and Colin Craig Models, which also produces the clamp locks.

All this equipment is linked together by cables housed in concrete troughs (3) running alongside the track. Models of this can be sourced from Wills (2/4mm scale) and Ten Commandments (2/4/7mm scales).

#### **SIGNS**

In the world of ever increasing Health & Safety consciousness, signs are becoming more and more visible and therefore essential to any modern layout. This scene from Platform 3 at Didcot shows some typical signs that aren't often shown on layouts.

The main sign featured that should be found on any Modern Layout is the 'Stop' marker. These are placed where trains are to stop according to their length (for example 2/3 car stop). Placing these on a layout and using them when operating will make operation look so much more realistic and enjoyable.

Another large part of the modern world is advertising and you can't escape it on the railways. Even though the poster board shown actually displays an operational notice for FGW drivers, it is the same type of board that is used to promote a whole plethora of products, services and offers, as well as timetables.

Finally, a huge amount of operational notices, boards and signs are seen, far too numerous to go into detail here, but the notice shown indicates a change from the Cab Secure Radio to GSM (Global System for Mobile Communications), which is slowly being installed across the British network.

For more information on signs, visit www.railsigns.uk. Such signs can easily be reproduced using Microsoft Word software or from digital photographs using a graphics package, then printed out and stuck to some plastic card before mounting on some plastic tube.

#### **MILEPOSTS**

Mileposts are a vital part of the railway that have been with us since the very beginning, yet they

are rarely modelled. This could be down to the fact that some people are not actually sure about their meaning. Well, despite their name, mileposts are located at 1/, mile intervals, and refer to miles and chains (one chain is 22 yards). So, the number is the mileage (starting at Milepost o) and each dot/line under it signifies 20 chains (there being 80 chains to a mile). In this photograph at Swindon, the post indicates 77 miles and

77 1



20 chains from London Paddington, while the next one west will read 77 with two lines to signify 77 miles and 40 chains, or 77  $^{1}/_{2}$  Miles.

The reason for having these is not to tell passengers where they are but to give drivers a reference point when they stop in an emergency and need to inform signallers of their position. Also, they can be used by maintenance teams as location reference points. Gradient posts are no longer installed on the railway.

#### **STATION DETAILS**

Railway stations have changed massively in recent years to cater for the rising number of passengers and their changing needs, so our model 'customers' should have the same standard of miniature facilities. To the right, this scene at West Drayton on the Great Western main line typifies the facilities provided at many stations.

Some shelter is required to protect passengers (1) from our unpredictable weather. Nowadays these are often of the modern antivandal type seen here, although the old Network SouthEast style and BR shelters can still be seen in some places. Excellent modern platforms shelters are now available from Bachmann in 4mm scale, but nothing else is available from the

main manufacturers. I have 3-D printed a model based on the Paragon Anti-Vandal shelter, but other than those examples, scratchbuilding is necessary.

In this age of instant mobile communications, train information has to be instant too, so platforms should have the proper information screens (2) for passengers. In real life these use real-time train information and some are directly linked to the signalling system to provide information, although we don't need this on a model!

Bachmann offers some resin models as part of its 4mm scale 'Station Modernisation Pack', while again I have 3-D printed models to get around the general lack of station details.

The most common way of operating trains since the 1980s is 'Driver Only Operation' (DOO) where the driver drives the train and oversees station stops. To aid the driver, DOO equipment is placed at the end of the platform in the form of large mirrors (3) or monitors linked to CCTV cameras. Some new trains have rear facing CCTV cameras linked to screens on the driver's desk, reducing the need for fixed equipment at stations. Again the only models to be had are scratch build versions, or I have 3-D printed Models. BRM

## BRM MEETS... MODELLERS MECCA

## **Phil Parker** visits a growing retailer in the West Midlands that is a little different to your average corner shop

ucked away in the back streets of
Wall Heath, nine miles north of
Kidderminster, is a long established
model shop, but one with its eyes
firmly fixed on the future.

Modellers Mecca first opened its doors in 1970 and moved to the current shop 18 years later. Nine years ago, the original owners were looking to retire and sell the business. Fortunately, long time customer, Lucy Pitch, decided not to do what most of us would in this situation - buy a few last items in the sale and start looking for a new supplier - she jumped out of the IT world, took a trip to the bank and ended up as the new owner.

Stock levels had been run down in anticipation of closure but this was quickly reversed and now

customers can chose from over 8,000 items. There's no spare wall space in the shop and down the centre, racks of plastic card (Slater's and Evergreen), baskets of discounted wagons, Airfix kits, Ratio models and a vast range of adhesives lead the visitor to cabinets full of locomotives and rolling stock at the back of the shop.

All this is supported by an impressive stock control system. When I asked Lucy how many different suppliers they dealt with, a few keystrokes brought back the answer - 45. This level of sophistication means that the website always shows exactly how many of any item are in stock at any time. Before the new computers, stocktaking was an almost continuous process but now if you check the site and spot 40 Peco PL-11 point motors in stock

and need 39 of them, you can be confident that you'll get what you order.

This might seem overly complicated, most shops seem to run with little more than a posh cashbox, but 70% of sales are over the counter which can play havoc with stock control. Many people chose to check the web before jumping in the car so they want to know that items are available if shown on screen. Web sales are important, making up two-thirds of the rest, but it seems that for many customers, being able to handle something before they buy still trumps the convenience of ordering while in your pyjamas.

Once in the shop, you have access to a wealth of advice and information. Lucy is a P4 modeller currently building Walsall in P4, this after being

introduced to the hobby by her parents when young and progressing thorough many OO gauge layouts. To see progress on the layout, visit her website: www.p4walsall.com

Behind the counter you'll find at various times Norman, Paul, Marie and John, all modellers in their own right. Norman enjoyed a moment of fame on **RMWeb** a couple of years ago with his fantastic model of a Rivet Counter Detection Van and associated train. As he says, it is supposed to be a fun hobby after all, although the quality of workmanship would keep many working on 'serious' projects happy.

Paul looks after DCC matters, something that is of growing importance as this now accounts for around 50% of customers' requirements. A test track behind the counter wired with several DCC systems in addition to analogue control means you can try before you buy to make sure your model works and sounds right.

John is in charge of repairs and is kept busy with four or five models a week requiring attention. I'm told that he's got a healthy waiting list for this service so people must be happy with the results.

Of course, you can't keep everyone happy. Most shops have horror stories involving non-customers arriving and needing help with models bought elsewhere. One man arrived with a Hornby Flying Scotsman set bought from an online auction that wouldn't work and asked if it could be repaired as it was to be given as a Christmas present. A quick look revealed an empty space where the tender should have been, hardly ideal when this contains the motor!

Modellers Mecca also sell what they term 'Second User' models. It's a big part of the business and would be even bigger except that it's difficult to find enough stock. Modellers seem to sit on unused items until they have a grand clearout. While the shop buys in job lots, it is just as happy to make offers on individual items.

Having said this, true collectors make up a very small part of the sales. This is very much a shop aimed at the active modeller. Most purchases come from bits and pieces rather than 'big ticket' items. Indeed, as prices have risen, sales have diminished with people who would have purchased three or four locomotives per year now buying one or two.

Even when people want to buy, it's not always easy to satisfy demand. Hornby's LNER P2 should

have been popular with over 20 pre-ordered but in the event, only two were supplied by Margate. This sort of problem is leading customers to cancel orders as they discover it's only possible to buy direct. As it is, during my visit, there were lots of red box wagons available at sale prices both in the shop and online and a suggestion that the range may vanish off the shelves altogether in the future.

While the best seller is Peco OO track, the Ratio and Wills ranges are also very popular and an Albion Alloys rack of brass strips and shapes has to be refilled regularly providing a good guide to the interests of the customers.

Whilst 4mm scale still rules, N gauge is creeping up in popularity and for O gauge fans,

a selection of Parkside and Slater's wagon kits can be found at the back of the shop. In narrow gauges, the Peco 009 rolling stock flew off the shelves when it first arrived. This has now slowed, but the expectation is that once Heljan and Bachmann bring out suitable locomotives, interest will pick up again.

A growing range of in-house projects are also appearing on the shelves. Working corridor connections for pretty much any RTR coach fill a rack beside the door. On the counter are readywired fishplates for those who find soldering wires to track too difficult.

The latest project is an exclusive Bachmann limited edition 22t ZGV 'Tube' wagon in Satlink Western red/yellow (pictured below) which will soon be available. Full details are available and pre-orders are now being accepted.

With the prices of RTR items heading upwards, efforts have been made to help the customer. Models can be 'put by' for up to three weeks for customers so if you spot something on the website and can't immediately get to the shop, you won't miss out.

A saving scheme exists allowing credit to be built up and then used on products. Friends and family can add to this directly or by buying gift vouchers. There are also two loyalty schemes that accumulate points that can be redeemed as discounts in the future.

At the end of the day, the best model shops do more than just throw boxes across a counter. Help and advice from experienced modellers and a friendly atmosphere make a huge difference and encourages 'newbies' and long-term hobbyists alike. Lucy tells me that very few people leave without buying something - I know I didn't. **BRM**







have always been fascinated with realism in model railways, and the ones I've loved have been the ones that drew me into their little world. All of Gordon Gravett's masterpieces, for example, have done this.

However, all too frequently, the illusion is shattered by having superbly modelled locomotives and stock moving past unrealistically static figures and vehicles. When I built 'The Loop', I avoided having both figures and vehicles (except for a couple of derelicts) for this very reason - but it did get me thinking.

Working in 7mm scale, I thought it would be fun to try and build a radio-controlled lorry.

I know Faller has its car system for HO/OO and N, but I wanted something that I could actually drive around, and that might interact with a railway.

I bought a Corgi Vanguards Morris Commercial (one of the few genuinely 1:43 scale die-cast models out there) from eBay and spent a happy few months discovering the world of miniature radio control, and building a working lorry. When I started,

I assumed I was going to end up with a box van, or a lorry carrying a permanent 'load' concealing the radio gear, but it soon became apparent that it was going to be possible to hide it all due to its extremely small size, and that I was going to be able to achieve a flatbed lorry. This became a real game-changer! As soon as you have a flatbed lorry, you can put it to real work - and that of course means building a layout for it to work on, and thus 'The End of The Line' was born.

## **BASICS**

As we live in quite a small house, the layout also had to be small, and it is only 5' x 3' of scenic area. Operations are based around a practical transshipment process; coal is brought in by a narrow gauge (0-14) railway in three tipper wagons per train. They are propelled either to tip into standard gauge wagons waiting below, or to tip onto a conveyor which in turn will load one of two lorries waiting to take the coal to a more local destination.

The layout itself is built entirely on insulating foam, glued together and carved to profile, and then glued to a rectangular baseboard frame! The landscape is then scrimmed – that is covered with four-inch square butter-muslin soaked in a plaster/ PVA mix. This makes a strong surface that doesn't crack, and takes paint well. The surface is painted a thin brown or grey, making sure no white is showing, and then it is ready for grassing and road making.

## **GRASS**

Grass was next, and initially I used a Noch Gras-Master, although this has now been replaced by a Green Scenes 'Flock-It', as I find it gives better results.

When laying grass, you must decide what season you are going to model, and whether it is scrubland, pasture, or whatever, as there are so many differences to consider. Always check photographs and get out there to look at the real thing!

I used three different types of grass fibres in my

**DETAILS ADDING TEXTURE TO GRASS** 

The technique is simple, but very effective. Dab a little PVA on top of some existing grass or wherever you wish to create a clump or tuft, take a small handful of your grass 'mix' of fibres, and rub them between the palms of your hands as you used to when making plasticine snakes as a child. When you have made a reasonably tight 'snake' or cigarette of grass fibres, pinch one end off, and stick it into your PVA - and LEAVE IT! Once it has dried, vacuum it off (remembering to reclaim the excess) and you will have a nice realistic tuft that blends in perfectly with the rest of your grass.


Long grass is done in the same way, but instead, mix 80% standard length and 20% long grass. This spaces out the long fibres, and avoids the unrealistic 'I've-just-glued-a-paint-brush-tomy-layout' appearance.

mad and glazed every pane individually, so that they all reflect light at slightly different angles (as real buildings do) but I can't say that anyone has actually noticed!

The weighbridge itself is finished with Humbrol's Metallic Gunmetal (and some rust, of course) with the tyre tracks then polished up - a trick that the gunmetal paint does brilliantly!

Trees are a composite of techniques; they have armatures of green florist's wire, bound and glued, pasted up with a DAS/PVA mix, which allows some texturing, and then painted. Choice sprigs of sea moss were then added as branches and blended in with the DAS/PVA. Although this technique gives a somewhat stylized result, it has been acceptable.

A backscene is something that can make-orbreak a layout when it comes to creating and maintaining an illusion. I intended to keep mine very simple, and to avoid the typical blue sky we so often see. Our weather is often dull and overcast -I wanted to portray that.

The backscene itself is 6mm 'Bendy MDF' from our local B&Q. This has a good smooth surface and the painting was simplicity itself. I first sprayed the whole thing with a white aerosol primer, and after a few minutes of drying I then sprayed the top half with grey primer in horizontal strokes - varied, as these were going to represent cloud cover. The grey got thinner and less even (but always horizontal) as it got lower, never fully reaching the bottom, where it was still white.

A few white cloud highlights were sponged in occasionally, and that was it – and it has been

# **KEY DETAILS** MAKING ROADS



The roads were 'spread' with PVA/plaster first, to get the contours I wanted, and when dry painted thinly with PVA and sieved ash spread over the top. I find ash a very good scenic medium; I collect it from the remnants of fires and hoard it. It tends to come in different colours and textures and is extremely useful for yards, lanes, paths, roads and much more. After the glue has dried, the excess ash is vacuumed off with a pair of old tights on the end of the nozzle to reclaim what hasn't been used.

## LOCOMOTIVE FLEET

In order to get good running of four wheel locomotives, I always try to use the lightest wire possible for pick-ups (preferably 0.3mm nickelsilver), and try to have one axle slightly rocking, rather than completely rigid. The two fleets consist of the following;

## **NARROW GAUGE**

Lister: KBScale (ex-Roy Link)
Simplex: Roy Link
Bagnall 0-4-0ST: Roy Link
Fowler Marshall: WrightLines

## **STANDARD GAUGE**

Hudswell, Clarke 0-6-0ST: Ixion Ex-LYR 'Pug' 0-4-0ST: Springside BR Class 04 0-6-0DM: Bachmann Brassworks surprisingly effective. Best of all, it took about 15 minutes from beginning to end!

# **TRACK & ELECTRICS**

It was vital that all locomotives should run well and reliably on this railway, and would need to do so under exhibition conditions. Given the small size of the layout this also meant low speeds. DCC was the obvious choice, and it also meant very simple wiring, particularly doing away with a control panel and all the extra cabling and connections that that entails. Consequently there is a two-wire feed to the layout (via a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" jack plug) and two wires to feed each fiddle yard – again each with a single jack-plug connector.

My controller is a Gaugemaster Prodigy Advance 2 system, which runs locomotives, point motors and the conveyor (which is activated by a locomotive decoder)

Great effort was made to ensure reliable running, particularly as the narrow gauge is operated with small 0-4-os. Firstly, when the track was laid, it was buffed with silver polish to get rid of all the manufacturing grime, and all the minute scratches in the surface. It was then wiped over with a soft graphite pencil. This treatment means that no conventional cleaning of the track is ever required, and that only occasional further graphite wipes keep the thing running, together with very

occasional wheel cleaning. No abrasives coarser than silver polish are ever used on the track!


Points are powered by Tortoise motors, via a Switch 8 interface, all of which is very simple and reliable - as long as you keep your wits about you! Track is the excellent KBScale for the 0-14 railway, and a mixture of Peco with a handmade C&L point on the standard gauge.

The reversing triangle on the narrow gauge is a nice unusual feature, but solves the problem of getting trains to face the right direction for tipping. The Tortoise point motors do all the necessary switching required for it to work electrically.

'The End of The Line' took a very enjoyable year to build, and on the exhibition circuit it has won numerous awards, most recently 'Best 7mm Layout' at the 2014 Warley National Model Railway Exhibition.

The layout has now been passed on to Tim Crockford, who is to continue exhibiting it with his own very high quality lorries and stock, hopefully for years to come. This will allow me to concentrate on my next project!

I must conclude by thanking my lovely wife, Diane, for her encouragement and her competent operation at all the shows, together with Martin Coombs and Ken Jackson - the other half of the operating team. **BRM** 






deliveries of 'heavy' oil from Milford Haven and Lindsey refineries, which were notable for bringing 'foreign' locomotives into the Black Country. Bachmann's 100t TEA wagon in a Gulf livery has only been produced as an exclusive edition for TMC and a short rake of six was acquired for BCB.

Paul Bartlett's photographic website is one of the best internet resources for obtaining images of wagons as they appeared in and after service. A selection of suitable reference images for the project was purchased and downloaded. Printing the images out makes a handy reference point whilst working to replicate examples. **BRM**

I've taken to using Pinnacle Modelling Supplies 'pro effect' weathering pigments, not just for their finish and adherence but for the fact that they come in a dumpy jar to minimise the risk of accidental spillage. Their 'steel' pigment gives a lustrous finish which is well suited to the oily sheen that developed across the wagons. Pinnacle's dark mud, volcanic sand and dark brown earth are particularly useful for this project, again used in sweeping vertical strokes.



Oil spillages from the two outermost filler points were created with Winsor & Newton's Black Indian Ink applied in careful vertical lines with a fine-pointed calligraphy pen. It's near impossible to create the fine dribbles seen on the real thing but it gives a passable impression. A little texture or thickness can be added to the oil steaks by lightly brushing over the ink with black weathering powders.

Light coats of acrylic paints were airbrushed in vertical strokes to build up the streaking found on the real thing. The acrylic 'Rail Weathering Set' from Lifecolor is a good basis to work from and UA-723 Rail Weathered Black makes a good base layer to build up the density over obscured livery details. This has a slightly greenish tinge to the blackness which is a pleasing tone and is followed by further light applications of UA-720 Rail Track Dirt, UA-721 Rail Sleeper Grime and UA-722 Rail Roof Dirt. I also included one of my favourite weathering acrylics, Tamiya's XF-84 Dark Iron.



The centre point of the roof of the tanks is a sampling point and would rarely see the same level of oil spillage, there may be a little, but observation of the images from Paul Bartlett's site will give an idea of the levels which are occasionally seen.



After all the layers have been built up it's important to clean back to some of the livery details which were required in general usage such as the white stars and the axlebox covers. Light vertical strokes with the fibreglass brush will remove the pigments and airbrushed weathering to reveal the factory applied details. Further pigments are applied to the bogie, wheels and springs to give the 'in-service' look.



# **SERVICING FOR SMALL TEAM LOCOMOTIVES**



As the water tower doesn't belong to any railway company, it can be fitted to most layouts. The coaling stage will have enough capacity for a small tank locomotive.

The water tower has two hoses and operating arms, so should really be found between two tracks. To modify it for a single track is easy, cut off one hose and pull the arm above it out of the top.

I'd like to weather my locomotives but don't want to risk ruining them. Can you suggest a firm who can do the work for me?

**Phil Parker says:** Several companies advertise weathering services in the pages of **BRM**, however, before parting with your cash, why not have a go yourself? Making your rolling stock look like it's earning a living isn't difficult and can be great fun.

You say you are nervous about ruining a lococomotive - that's perfectly understandable. New RTR models aren't cheap, so don't start with your latest purchase. Instead, find something that is so cheap it doesn't matter if you ruin it.

Normally we'd suggest something from a second hand stall, preferably hauled out of one of those tatty cardboard boxes under the table,

but I might have found an even better candidate

(or victim) for first attempts.

Browsing one of the cheapo shops on my local high street, I spotted something described on the box as a 'finely detailed realistic toy train' for £4.99.

As you can see, it lacks a certain prototype fidelity but you do get a locomotive and most importantly, three wagons. These are lovely test pieces for experiments since they have some detail - not unlike a proper model.

Start with weathering powders as these are



easily washed off if you don't like the result. Another advantage of these wagons is that you can put them in the sink with the washing up as there's no metal to ruin.

At one end of a wagon, I used brown and black Humbrol weathering powers applied with a cheap, bristle brush. Results after a few minutes work aren't bad and the end of the wagon looks a lot more careworn than the pristine end.

After playing with a few techniques on rolling stock like this, move on to real wagons and then to cheaper locomotives. Eventually you'll be confident enough to tackle any subject.



I decided to move the coaling stage steps from the front to one side. To make it easier for my firemen, a couple of steps were added at the bottom from 2mm thick plastic sheet.



The coal stage needs to be carefully placed so your largest locomotive can run alongside without hitting it. Don't glue it down before you've checked this.



A little black weathering powder simulates spilt coal - you could use real crushed coal or even dry black powder paint, but not too much. Coal was expensive, so big lumps would be chucked back on the deck for use in



Under the water hose, model the dripping water with a couple of blobs of varnish. Anything will do here as only a tiny amount is required.





# HALF CAB CREW FOR MIDLAND 1F



The Bachmann 00 gauge Midland 1F is a lovely little model, but the half-cab version looks unnaturally empty

without a footplate crew. Can you recommend a supplier for suitable driver and fireman figures?

**Phil Parker says:** Finding a suitable set of figures has just been made simpler by Falcon Figures which has added a crew to its 4mm scale range, designed specifically for the Bachmann Midland 1F model. The driver's hand is at the perfect height to touch the regulator handle, while the fireman leans against the coal bunker.

Cleanly cast in lead-free pewter, the unpainted models (£5.00 per set) will require some careful brush painting to complete before fitting, or you can order them fully painted for £9.00 per set.

options are available, this has always worked well for me and the materials are easily available.

Parts are removed from etches using a medium sized knife with snap-off blades. A fresh cutting edge ensures that parts don't bend when being cut and since you need less pressure to cut, they don't ping off quite as far when freed.

as far When Heed.

Chassis construction started on a round soldering mat sold by Pinnacle Modelling Supplies which is made of a fibrous material able to handle the heat from the iron.

All whitemetal parts were attached with Zap-a-Gap green label superglue. It might not seem to be 'proper' modelling to use this stuff, but on well-fitting castings it works perfectly and also takes care of any small gaps in between. I've a couple of models built nearly 20 years ago and they haven't fallen apart yet.

Rivets are marked on etched parts with dimples half-etched in the rear surfaces. These should be punched out using a spiked tool.

I've successfully used everything from a small nail hit with a little hammer to a sophisticated press from GW Models costing nearly £100. For most people, the gravity riveter shown at the front will be perfect. Just place the spike in the dimple,

raise the weight and let it go to make the rivet. The tool costs just £12 from Eileen's Emporium.

In the final part of his introduction to locomotive building, **Phil Parker** tackles a small o-6-oT kit and assembles a simple etched chassis.

eaching the final part of our locomotive kit-building trilogy, it's time to tackle a pretty conventional kit. This one isn't aimed specifically at beginners, but instead makes the builder source components from several different sources.

Having said that, there's no point in being silly. We still want all the parts to fit without major modification, so I've picked a good quality kit. I'm also cheating slightly by picking a model that can be obtained complete, with the supplier providing all the bits required to save running around to different vendors.

Normally you purchase a locomotive kit and then have to acquire the motor, wheels and gears to suit. This isn't as daft as it sounds. If you ask three modellers what specification they require you'll probably get four different replies.

In 4mm scale there will be OO, EM and P4 modellers for a start. Some will like easy-to-use Romford wheels whilst others prefer the finesse of Gibson or Ultrascale products. The choice of motor is limited for a small prototype but there will always be someone who wants 'Rolls-Royce' quality and pricey Swiss coreless motors instead of the conventional cored version. Even gearing ideas vary - on some layouts I prefer 50:1 but have used 108:1 where I need the model to really crawl.

Our locomotive kit this month, South Eastern Finecast's Wainwright SECR 'P' Class o-6-OT tries to cater for all these demands as much as possible. The chassis spacers are supplied in all 4mm:1ft scale gauges. You can omit some of the frame spacers if your chosen motor/gearbox needs extra space too and should you chose to compensate or spring the chassis, the rods can bend

and markings show where you'll need to cut for hornblocks.

Most of the work involves building the chassis, a welldesigned unit made from easy-to-solder nickel silver. Tabs and slots locate the main parts together and as long as it's built carefully,

The SEF kit consists of etched chassis frets and some large whitemetal parts for the body. There's also a bag full of tiny whitemetal detail parts, some brass wire and handrail knobs.

there's no need for special tools to line things up.

I sourced the wheels from Romford - the square ended axles make quartering easy and you can take them on and off without damaging anything. A Mashima motor and gearbox provides the drive, but a packing error resulted in me ending up with the wrong motor. A quick telephone call got me an apology and replacement.

The loco body is made of whitemetal parts that are cleanly cast, needing only a tiny bit of tidying up before assembly. There are some clever touches such as chamfered edges around the cab doors so that visible edges are as thin as possible



When the manufacturer says a kit requires a motor, gears and wheels to complete, this is what they mean. The wheels, axles and crankpins are Romford, the gearbox from South Eastern Finecast and a Mashima motor. This is what you get when buying a complete kit.

- something some RTR manufacturers would be wise to copy.

Detailing is mostly with more whitemetal parts and here the makers have been very kind and supplied spare parts so that if anything is broken during assembly, you aren't stuck trying to scratchbuild a replacement.

# SECR 'P' CLASS



Conceived by Harry Wainwright in 1908 and introduced a year later, the South Eastern & Chatham Railway's 'P' Class locomotives were intended to replace steam railmotors which were found to be underpowered and inflexible to operate on suburban lines in south-east London and Kent.

Eight were eventually built in two batches. Generally, they were found to be satisfactory for their intended duties although the small coal capacity required extra coaling points to be installed along lines where they worked. Eventually they were displaced to station pilot and shunting duties by more powerful classes.

The class worked across the entire SECR system and two (Nos. 27 and 753) were even shipped to Boulogne in 1915. Here, working for the ROD, they assisted in construction of sorting sidings for the First World War effort. Both were repatriated in 1916.

All eight survived into BR ownership but a reduction in suitable work saw the first withdrawal in 1955 (No. 31555). A couple were sold to industry, No. 31178 to Bowaters paper mill at Ridham Dock, where it worked internal passenger trains until 1968 and No. 31556 to James Hodson's mill in Robertsbridge. The last left BR service in 1961. Half of the class have been preserved, with three resident at the Bluebell Railway - Nos. 31027, 31178 and 31323 - and No. 31556 currently dismantled pending restoration at the Kent & East Sussex Railway.

Detail differences were minor, but included two different styles of buffers; smokebox rivets were initially domed but these were replaced with flush rivets and eventually welding. Furness lubricators at the base of the smokebox were removed in the 1920s. Extended bunkers and toolboxes were also sported by some locomotives for short periods.

Livery was initially fully lined SECR green. ROD locomotives were painted grey with large tank numbers. Southern green, lined black and wartime black were carried and in BR days, plain black was the standard.

# STEP-BY-STEP **GUIDE**



First job with the chassis is to chose your gauge. Three sets of frame spacers are supplied for OO, EM and P4. Working in OO, I picked the narrowest ones.



There are a lot of frame spacers in the kit. All are nicely shown on an exploded diagram, but putting them in place can be a bit of a three-handed job. Working on a Pinnacle soldering mat, I was able to hold the first sideframe in place with pins and attach most of the spacers, making things a lot easier.



Romford wheels are supplied insulated and uninsulated. Here you can see the ring of Tufnol between the metal centre and nickel silver rim that insulates one from the other. Each axle needs one insulated and one uninsulated wheel. All the uninsulated wheels are fitted to one side and the insulated ones to the other. Be careful not to mix this up or you'll have a short-circuit when the locomotive is placed on the track.



For testing, the rods are held on to the wheels with some insulation stripped from electrical cable. At this point the chassis should run freely, I had to open the holes on the connecting rods out very slightly for this. If anything sticks at this point, sort it out. Don't try to run it in later, it never works.








Once everything runs, chassis detailing can be carried out with lamp irons, brake hanger wires and brackets for the back end fitted. The brake system can be made up as a separate item that can be later clipped on.

A coat of car etching primer and the chassis is ready for paint. I prefer Railmatch Weathered Black brushed on for this job. Once the paint is touch dry, but not hard, any on the bearing surfaces is quickly scraped away to maintain electrical contacts.


Connecting rods are made up from two layers of metal and can be assembled in several ways. I've picked the simplest, solid, version. The inner ends are designed to allow the rod to flex and have to be removed for this option. The break lines are half-etched so these parts can be broken off with pliers.




The first job with the footplate is to fit the retaining nuts. A smear of epoxy glue is ideal to hold them in place.



The castings are very clean, but there is a little flash to remove with an old scalpel blade or scraper. The worst is in the spectacle plates, but this takes a matter of seconds to remove.



While the front of the chassis is retained with a conventional nut and bolt, at the back, a small casting acts as a clip, locating the chassis top.



checking everything fits and doing this before the tank sides go on allows a 'better than normal' view of the insides.



Even for 00, the frames are very narrow allowing the axles to move from side to side. While a little sideplay is desirable, there should only be a tiny amount. The rest is removed by inserting washers supplied on the etch between the wheels and the chassis.



Without the body you can clearly see the tiny motor. Before fitting, the shaft has to be shortened on one end. A large pair of wire cutters will do this but sawing it off with a needle file is neater. Keep the swarf away from the motor.

A Veroboard square is supplied to be bolted to a plate underneath. To this the pickups are soldered. Wire is included for this but I prefer 28swg phosphor-bronze for the job. Pick-ups are only needed on the insulated side as the chassis is live because of the uninsulated wheels. One wire from the motor is soldered to a spacer.

The complete layout is DCC with a few engines equipped with sound and lights. Control is by a Hornby Elite connected to a computer where I am still experimenting with different software.







these days. The only refinement missing is etched brass cabside numberplates to give the relief so



apparent on ex-GWR locomotives, but these can be sourced quite readily from the trade.

There are, however, a few of minor omissions/ niggles apparent; the handrails on the footplate above the front steps are missing, the fire iron brackets on the rear of the bunker, which are commendably fitted as separate metal components, are very robust and at least twice scale width. In fairness, to make them dead-scale might mean easy breakage through careless handling. The lower lamp brackets on the bunker rear are moulded on giving a poor representation, whilst the upper lamp brackets both front and rear are totally omitted. The water tank mushroom vents look a little under scale size and possibly susceptible to breakage. Any of the items criticised above could be easily improved if they're considered to be that offensive. For example the fire iron brackets could be filed down nearer to scale width or replacements fashioned from brass strip.

## **PERFORMANCE**

The performance of the model was, as now expected and normal, very good straight from the box with beautifully smooth running, in both directions, between walking speed and a rather excessive top speed. This excellence should be further improved with running-in as recommended by the manufacturer. On the club layout the model happily hauled a train of eight Bachmann Mk 1 coaches or 20 proprietary covered vans, a more than respectable load for a locomotive with a '2P' classification. Most kit-builders would have to try very hard to match the running of this new locomotive.

A conventional six-pin DCC decoder socket is mounted on the chassis ahead of the motor. Recommended decoders include Bachmann's 36-558A, Lenz Silver Mini 10311, Gaugemaster DCC22 or DCCconcepts' new 'Zen' ZN6D. Conversion to DCC operation should be quick and straightforward.

This splendid pannier should be welcomed by the modeller, giving an alternative to the existing, larger '57XX' tanks. The model, whilst not absolutely 'perfect', is very good and can be recommended, particularly to the BR Western Region modeller. It represents superb value for money.

# **FACT FILE: GWR '64XX'**

In 1930 the GWR set about updating its fleet of small pannier tanks in the '850' and '2012' classes. A prototype was produced by fitting larger 5' 2" diameter wheels to No. 2080, in which form it ran for a few months before being returned to original condition. A second prototype was produced later in 1930 using the frames from withdrawn No. 2062, again fitted with 5' 2" diameter driving wheels, but also with a new type of boiler. The 'new' locomotive was renumbered 5400. After a few months in service No. 5400 was again withdrawn and returned to Swindon where it was fitted with 4' 712" diameter wheels, becoming the prototype for the '64XX' class.

> After proving its viability, the locomotive was withdrawn and broken up.

The new '54XX' class appeared in late-1931, 25 locomotives being built by late-1935. '64XXs' appeared from early-1932, and 40 had been built by mid-1937. These classes were regarded as passenger machines and were fitted with a screw reverser, auto-train fittings and were early recipients of Automatic Train Control (ATC). The '54XXs' were principally used in London and the Home Counties, while the '64XXs' were principally used in the South Wales valleys, the West Midlands and around Plymouth. They were used

on more arduous duties that were considered beyond the capacity of the earlier 0-4-2Ts. A third new class was the '74XX' introduced in

1936. Fifty were built by 1950, the last ten by British Railways. These were externally almost identical to the later examples of the '64XX' but carried a higher pressure boiler and, as they were classified as goods locomotives, they were fitted with lever reversers rather than the screw reverser.

The '64XXs' were built at Swindon in four lots, and as may be expected several minor alterations were made during construction, the most noticeable being an alteration to the cab/ bunker area. The first 30 (Nos. 6400-29) had a large radius curve between the back of the cab and the top of the coal bunker, and the cab roof overhung the cab by a few inches at each end; however, on the last ten (6430-39) the joint between the cab and bunker was a right angled corner and the roof finished flush with the cab. These later locomotives also received footsteps welded to the fireman's side of the bunker and an additional handrail on the cab roof and side

from new. These features were retro-fitted to most - if not all - of the earlier examples. Later boilers were fitted with a new style and more prominent top feed casing, some of the earlier boilers were similarly rebuilt. Following boiler changes at works visits they became distributed throughout

the class, although they were not carried by all locomotives. There were several other detailed changes during their lives including the presence and size of the whistle shield and lubricators

modelled, D2383 led a tragically short life. Withdrawn on 18th April 1971, it had been cut up at T.W. Ward's yard in Beighton by late-June 1972, ending a career of little more than ten years.

Equipped with a six-pin DCC decoder in the cab, a cab interior light, detachable NEM couplings and push-fit bufferbeam sections for use in conjunction with the end detailing pack, it has all the features you'd expect of a small OO gauge diesel in the 21st century. Separately fitted

details abound, including an etched metal radiator grille, wire handrails and sprung metal buffers.

Neatly and accurately decorated, it will look the part as a station or goods yard pilot or shunting industrial sidings. A BR green Class 03 is one of those models that should be a fixture in the Bachmann range, as there is always likely to be demand for these useful little machines.

# DELUXE MATERIALS BALLASTING PRODUCTS



allast Bond is based on an industrial product used for stabilising hillsides, It looks like a very runny conventional glue but doesn't contain PVA. From the bottle, it quickly spreads through ballast and has so little surface tension it doesn't disturb the stones.

Used on granite ballast, it has the advantage over PVA of not reacting with the material and turning it green. Drying time appears to be similar to PVA, so the track is best left overnight.

If the bottle is fitted with a precision spout, liquid can be placed very accurately making it suitable for fixing coal in tenders or wagons.



In contrast, Ballast Magic is unusual in that it's a white powered glue designed to be mixed with the stones in a ratio of one part glue to 5-10 parts ballast and then spread dry on to a layout. Once you are happy with the look, spray water from

the supplied pump or an airbrush. This activates the granules and sticks it down.

The most impressive part is the speed at which the glue starts to work. Within seconds the baseboard can be tipped on its side without shedding ballast. Drying properly takes at least a couple of hours and is best left overnight.

All this is achieved with absolutely no mess. The glue doesn't seep so you can work right up to point tiebars without

worrying about them being gummed up. You'll need to shield card buildings with some cardboard or spray water from an airbrush set to a narrow flow.

# GRAHAM FARISH MIDLAND '4F'

since 1993; it

The impressive overhaul of Bachmann's N gauge range continues with this versatile goods locomotive, as **Ben Jones** discovers.

imple, rugged and powerful, the Midland/ LMS 4F 0-6-0s were 3875 amongst the most numerous classes ever built for Britain's railways. Directly descended from Victorian MR designs, the 772 locomotives never stole any headlines but instead did the dayto-day hard graft from which the railway really earned its income. As such, they are as essential to any LMS/London Midland Region locomotive fleet as 'Black Fives', 8Fs and 'linties'. There's been a 4F in the Graham Farish range

was revived by Bachmann in 2003 and although it was arguably one of the better 'old Farish' steam locomotives it is now well past its best. Following the example of Bachmann's OO gauge tly 4F, this replacement model takes the earlier Midland Railway variant as its inspiration, rather than the more numerous Fowler LMS type.


Like its bigger sister, this N gauge

Like its bigger sister, this N gauge model features a number of detail variations that would have been impossible with its predecessor. Reviewed here is BR black No. 43875 built at Derby Works as part of a batch in 1918/19. It is superbly finished in BR unlined black with finely printed numbers and early BR emblems. It has a Birmingham Saltley (21A) shedplate, dating the model between January 1952 and withdrawal in May 1956.

No. 43875 is typical of many of the Midland '4Fs' in BR days. Paired with an elderly Deeley MR tender, its Ramsbottom safety valves have been replaced with the Ross 'pop' type and it has lost its piston tail rods but it retains a narrow Fowler chimney

with capuchon. Of the other two 4Fs produced (but not reviewed), No. 43924 has the wider Stanier chimney and more familiar Fowler LMS tender, while LMS No. 3851 has a Deeley tender and narrow chimney.

Graham Farish hasn't disappointed those waiting for an all-new '4F'; indeed it is difficult to find fault with the model. The shape compares well with prototype photographs and published drawings/dimensions, while the attention to detail is in a different league to the old model.

As you look closer the crisp detail becomes even more evident. The front end face is accurate and convincing, the 'G7S' boiler and its fittings capture the look of the original and the cab interior is a delight, with a finely decorated backhead and hinged metal fallplate.

Even in this small scale, details such as rivet heads and clack valve on the right hand side of the boiler (and its associated pipework), snifting valves either side of the smokebox saddle and lubricators on the left hand running plate are very well executed. Despite being locomotive-drive, there's all the necessary 'daylight' between the boiler and frames and even a representation of the inside valvegear under the boiler. All very impressive.

Equally good is the Deeley tender, which captures the Victorian character of the prototype beautifully. If anything, it is better than the OO gauge version, which lacked relief on the underframe detail - there are no such problems here. The flared top of the tender tank is worthy of closer inspection, as are the coal rails and footplate details. For DCC conversion, the top simply unclips to reveal the six-pin decoder

socket – it couldn't be easier. The tender is permanently attached to the locomotive by a coupling bar which also carries the electrical connections for the motor and pick-ups.

# **PERFORMANCE**

Hidden away in the locomotive is a slender coreless motor. The size and design of the locomotive means there's not much space for extra ballast weight, but reports suggest it is generally a smooth and quiet performer.

Unfortunately, our sample suffered with what appeared to be an assembly issue with the driving axles, which resulted in its progress being jumpy and inconsistent. Better running tender first than forwards, it managed to haul up to seven Mk 1 coaches or 17 shortwheelbase wagons. We believe that a 'fully fit' model would be capable of more than this, so it's worth checking at your local model shop before taking your 4F home.

Detachable couplings are fitted in NEM sockets at each end. A small pack of detailing parts includes cab doors and coupling hooks.

Graham Farish has been a good friend to LMS/LMR modellers in N over recent years, and the 4F is yet more evidence of the company's expertise in this field. After the regal splendour of the 'Princess Coronation' (January **BRM**), the 4F is a somewhat humbler machine, but no less important for that. Goods 0-6-os greatly outnumbered front line 'Pacifics' and while we wouldn't necessarily expect modellers to maintain the same ratio, any LMS/LMR layout should be able to justify at least a couple of these superb new models. Recommended. **BRM** 

# **FACT FILE: Midland 4F**

The Midland Railway built 192 '4Fs' between 1911 and 1922 - the most powerful development of a long line of 0-6-0s that evolved over several decades. Another five were added for the Somerset & Dorset Joint Railway in 1922. After the Grouping of 1923, LMS locomotive policy was heavily influenced by Derby and the '4F' became the new company's standard goods locomotive. A further 575 were built, with William Stanier authorising the last batch as late as 1941.

MR-built locomotives can be identified by their Ramsbottom safety valves, chimney and dome higher than the cab roof and right hand drive. LMS locomotives had a shorter chimney and dome to widen their route availability and were left hand drive. They also had Ross safety valves. Later modifications involved fitting a wider Stanier chimney.

The '4Fs' worked across much of the LMS network, from Scotland to the South Coast. They were mainly goods locomotives and were even used on the heaviest trains - often double-headed - but were also pressed into passenger use when required.



# TAMIYA PAINT STIRRER

idely available from model shops, Tamiya's paint stirrers are 150mm long stainless steel sticks with a 5mm wide paddle at one end and a small spoon on the other.

Although instructions are provided on the back of the card, unless you read Japanese you'll need to work out what to do, hardly rocket science if you've ever made a cup of

The paddle quickly stirs up lumps of pigment from the bottom of the tinlet and the stick is strong enough to allow you to dig deep in long-stored paint. It's possible to revive surprisingly old paint his way although you will be mixing for several minutes.

Clean-up is just a wipe with a cloth, perhaps with a dunk in some thinner first. If paint dries on the stick, it can be scraped off with a knife or fine emery paper.

# SHOULD YOU MIX PAINT AT ALL?

■ here is a school of thought amongst some modellers that the best way to ensure a long life for paint is never to mix it at all.

Simply let the pot stand so the pigment drops to the bottom underneath the liquid carrier medium. Then, when you wish to use it, scoop pigment on to a piece of plastic and then mix in a little medium also scooped out of the tin. Once you have finished painting, throw the mix away, don't put it back in the tin.

By not mixing the chemicals in the tinlet, air can't cause the paint to go off and it should last for many years.

# BADGER AIRBRUSH ELECTRIC STIRRER

f all this hand mixing is too much for you, how about an electric mixer? Badger's little device comprises a plastic handle containing the motor and two AA batteries. From the front, a removable 12cm long metal prong is topped with a flat mixing disk.

To use, place the disk in the paint and push the switch to 'on'. Results, even with long stored paint, were surprisingly quick with a good mix being achieved in around ten seconds. With results so fast and easy, the temptation is to keep mixing longer than normal. That's not a bad thing if like me, you are a bit impatient and tend to use paint before it's properly mixed resulting in a patchy gloss finish.

Only one danger needs to be avoided, taking the mixing disc out of the paint before switching it off. Do this and your work area will be liberally spattered with paint!

Cleaning is a little fiddly as the mixing disc has a pattern to help it do its job. A wipe with a cloth will get most of the paint off but a whizz in some thinners wouldn't be a bad idea, especially if the paint won't have time to dry before you mix another colour.

This device will strike many people as a slightly pointless gadget, after all we can all stir paint can't we? It's actually very good. Airbrush

users who need consistently mixed paint once thinners are added will find one especially useful.

STORING PAINT

odel paints have a surprisingly long life when air is kept out of the storage tin or jar. Many modellers

will have pots well over a decade old that can still be revived and used. The key is to ensure a good seal around the top of the container.

One trick is to store tinlets upside down.

This way the heavy pigment will settle against the lid creating an airtight seal. Make sure the lid is in place properly with a cloth first if required.



# AUHAGEN/BUSCH SCENIC PRODUCTS

**Ben Jones** tests some products and kits from Germany whilst building a scenic photographic diorama. How do they fair?

hen it comes to scenic products, accessories and kits, German manufacturers such as Faller, Noch and Kibri have become well known in the UK over the last few years. However, they are not the only suppliers from that country with products to interest British modellers.

Auhagen is based in what was East Germany and has an increasingly broad range of kits and building products that can be used as they are, or as aids to scratchbuilding. Busch meanwhile, can supply anything from 2mm scale crops to road vehicles and working narrow gauge field railways from its extensive catalogue. Both are now being imported into the UK by Golden Valley Hobbies, formerly known as Ontracks.co.uk.

# **AUHAGEN GIRDER BRIDGE**

It's not always easy to make bridges look realistic and effective on model railways. Too often they look what they are - simple plywood decks slung across a gap. But, this excellent Auhagen kit (pictured right) comes together like a real bridge, including fold-up stone supports, a main box girder that rests on neatly moulded feet and expansion rollers and an open deck that can be detailed and decorated according to taste, use or period.

With a footprint of 327mm by 65mm wide and at 110mm high, it will suit single-track branch lines from the post-Second World War era in particular. Clearance under the span is 78mm - sufficient for HO/OO trains or road vehicles.

Produced to a high standard, it assembles quickly and well, even if you're a beginner. The injection moulded plastic is supplied in different colours, but for the best effects I'd recommend painting/spraying it before assembly. I found the most difficult part to be getting the correct colours and weathering the stone supports. Although the stonework is embossed, the relief isn't that deep and it was a challenge to maintain the colour of the mortar when applying the stone colour. More experienced modellers will doubtless have a simple solution.


Once folded up, the supports can be simply pushed into slots in a polystyrene embankment (as I did) or worked into your scenery as required. I chose to hide any joins with WS foliage clumps, and added a few bits of greenery growing out of various gaps and dark, damp places.

Once finished in appropriate colours, with a few rusty streaks on the main girder and a rusty/metallic finish dry-brushed on the steel plates between the rails, it looks very effective and comes highly recommended.

Auhagen also produces a large range of building kits and architectural components that can be used in scratchbuilding projects. From windows to drainpipes, air-conditioning units and sectional walls, the possibilities it offers are unlimited.

Once the Peco track had been laid onto the cork base and fixed with PVA, it was time to add some ballast. At first glance, this mixed black, white and grey ballast from Busch looks too stark for use on British track. But with a little mixing with plain grey ballast and weathering with Railmatch track dirt spray, it can help to provide an authentic variety of colouring that more uniform products can't easily



Once mixed and weathered, it was applied using a Proses ballast spreader (also from Golden Valley Hobbies, £12.50). It was my first experience of using such a device and it didn't go entirely to plan, with the ballast spilling out too quickly, but some careful tending with a paintbrush persuaded it all into place. Once fixed with diluted PVA, Woodland Scenics 'Scenic Cement' or Busch Boden und Schotter (ground and gravel) glue it looks effective and is surprisingly good value.

**Verdict:** Good mix of colours, works well, reasonable price.

A recent visit to Golden Valley Hobbies' warehouse yielded a number of products that will be useful to British modellers, but have not been widely seen to date.

This 'Tried & Tested' differs somewhat from the normal format in that there's no step-bystep guide to using the products. Instead, I've incorporated as many of them as possible into a short embankment diorama that has allowed me

to practice a range of techniques that will be employed on my own layout when the scenic works start. Each one gets a short review. To complete the diorama, I also used a Woodland Scenics Landscape Starter Kit and static grasses and a Finescale Model Railways static grass device. It's not perfect, but for a first attempt it has turned out better than I expected and the various Auhagen and Busch products more than play their part in that. **BRM** 





# BUSCH SCENERY ADHESIVE

This extra runny PVA glue is specially formulated for hobby and scenic work and is supplied in a 125ml plastic bottle with a fine applicator nozzle and a separate pipette.

I found it too thick for ballasting work as supplied, but perfect for applying static grass, Woodland Scenics' thick turf clumps/fine turf and Gaugemaster/Noch foliage and grass clumps,

It can also be used to secure sand, crushed within a few hours

- Verdict: Low surface tension, versatile, good hold, but there are cheaper solutions.



Transmitter/receiver masts are the most visible evidence of the relentless march of mobile communications. There can be few places in the UK where they are not now seen, and they are becoming increasingly common at the lineside as Network Rail installs GSM-R mobile communications equipment across the system.

This pack contains enough parts to assemble two masts to your requirements; I built a short one of the type seen alongside railways and a much taller structure in grey, red and white, as is common in Germany. For each mast, a collection of microwave dishes, aerials and antennae is supplied, along with maintenance/ inspection platforms, ladders, a switchgear cabin and a wire mesh fence that can be assembled around the base of the mast. Also included are signs and even some placards from anti-mast demonstrators - a nice humorous touch!

I added the smaller of the two masts to my diorama, along with a small brick-built generator building borrowed from set by Faller. Although the pre-coloured plastic is OK, a quick squirt of grey primer and some light

weathering will result in a more pleasing finish. Perhaps not everyone's 'cup of tea', but an essential scenic accessory for the modern world nevertheless.

# STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE

# BUILDING THE EMBANKMENT

o show off these products, I built an embankment from a few spare materials I had saved 'just in case'. The basis is a hardboard off-cut. In hindsight, something about 50% wider would have been more suitable to achieve the right ratio between the height of the bridge and gradient of the embankment. It's far too steep as it is, but made a quick and cheap showcase for the bridge kit and an ideal practice project.





Using the hardboard as a template, I cut two pieces of Knauf expanded polystyrene insulation board rescued from a household DIY job, fixed them in place with UHU and then cut them to shape. As I didn't have a hot wire cutter to hand, I used an old bread knife, heated on the kitchen hob to slice through the Knauf board at the required angle. It's not perfect, but it worked well enough, although the knife won't be cutting any bread again - don't use your best cutlery for this job!





Once I was happy with the position of the Auhagen bridge, I then applied Woodland Scenics plaster bandage material (more often known here as 'Mod-Roc') over the top of the polystyrene to form the base of the landscape. Believe it or not, it was the first time I'd ever used this, but I found it to be an easy and satisfyingly messy job.



Once it had dried, it was painted with Woodland Scenics 'earth green' undercoat, although poster paint works just as well. Use earthy greens and browns to colour the plaster landscape before applying your grass.



On top of the embankment, a double layer of Proses cork trackbed was needed to match the height of the bridge deck. Again, this was fixed with UHU before the weathered concrete sleeper track was laid and ballasted (see above).



In a couple of areas where the grass didn't cover quite as well, I added WS dark turf fixed with Scenic Cement to fill the gaps, which had the added bonus of varying the colour and texture of the greenery. In a couple of places I also added narrow columns of ballast that have been washed out from the trackbed. Finally, any gaps around the bridge and base were hidden with WS dark green clumps, fixed with Busch scenic adhesive.



A few days later I summoned up the courage to have a first crack at 'static grassing' and was really pleased with the result. Using a Finescale Model Railways static grass device, a mix of Woodland Scenics and Javis green/brown fibres was applied quickly and easily.

Apart from the steep sides of the embankment, I was pleased with this first venture into scenics and found the Auhagen and Busch products a pleasure to use.

The first engine shed and the workshops comprising St. Margaret's, were built by the NBR in 1845. Mainly associated with the movement of coal and general freight traffic, the depot was never to match its close Edinburgh Haymarket neighbour in glamour of any form. Described as a dark, smoky hole filled with Reid's Relics, it was nevertheless staffed by first-class enginemen and was to remain largely faithful to steam until closed in 1967. Within this volume is related the history, the staff, including many anecdotes thereof, the allocated work and the engines which were based at the shed, including accidents and incidents in which they were involved. ike many on 17th December I was curious to see what Hornby had to offer for 2015. Consequently I logged onto the Hornby website and absorbed what delights the Margate firm was revealing.

Having digested what was new and appreciating some of the subtler aspects of the future introductions, I was amazed that within an hour or so my PC 'pinged' and there was a message from Hornby suggesting that I pre-order with them, presumably to avoid disappointment. I would certainly have expected this type of approach from

some of the larger retailers, those residing in Liverpool or Sheffield for example, but not from a major producer. But, why would I be surprised when a quick check of my inbox reveals that at the end of last November a large quantity of e-mails from Hornby promoting 'Black Friday' savings bombarded my computer, which was interesting, as they appeared to have started on the previous Tuesday!

Being serious, are we really witnessing a major change in the way our leading model railway producer is marketing and selling its products? How long will it be before the most desirable models will only be available direct from Hornby? What will be left for the loyal Hornby retailer; just the bits and pieces that Hornby do not wish to be bothered with? Of course other great brands sell direct, such as Lego, and closer to home so does Dapol and both from time to time offer 'exceptional' deals, so is Hornby

any different? Some may say yes as its approach seems to be much more focused and consistent.

Hornby, and prior to that Tri-ang, built an enviable reputation, either directly or via its Service Dealers for providing an excellent aftersales service to the model railway buying public, be they modellers or those who had simply purchased a train set and found it difficult to get it going.

Of course, over time things have changed and people's expectations have altered but through thick-and-thin Hornby stockists and in particular its Service Dealers were a valuable asset. Service

Dealers were ambassadors of the brand - some more than others - but they were there on the ground so to speak, waving the Hornby flag. Some of these dealers have been supporting Hornby at the sharp end for many years but in recent times little-by-little the reciprocal support they received from Margate has been eroded to a point where it is not surprising to hear long-term supporters asking the 'Why do we bother?'

That same question is being echoed by Hornby Stockists everywhere. Why should they support a company that gazumps the sales of the people who

have supported it for so many years, especially at the busiest time of year for selling?

It is not for me to comment on how Hornby conducts itself or to explain that loyalty is a two-way street. We live in an ever-changing commercial world with financial pressures being imposed from all quarters. I am sure that in time Hornby will explain its business model to not only its consumers but, more importantly, to its long-suffering and supportive retailers because in my opinion an explanation is long overdue.

I would suggest that at the moment Hornby is playing with fire. I also have a strong suspicion that there is no-one in the current ranks of Hornby decision-makers who has any practical knowledge or general commercial understanding when it comes to model railways.

What Hornby does - and has done for many years - is rely heavily on its Dealer network for aftersales support and the highlighting of problems. I believe that it would be impractical for Hornby to even think that it could manage without this feedback and assistance from its Dealers.

So Hornby think on; no brand is indispensable in this day and age. You may test the loyalty of your Service Dealers but remember they can also be very selective as to which products to stock and which to ignore. Can you really afford for them to do that? **BRM**
